

Hamrick Heads Memorial Drive For Kennedy

RALEIGH — Governor Terry Sanford has announced the appointment of Rush Hamrick, Jr. of Shelby to be Chairman for Cleveland County in the statewide drive to raise North Carolina's portion of funds for the John Fitzgerald Kennedy Library.

Dr. Billy Graham will be one of the featured speakers paying tribute to President John F. Kennedy in Kenan Stadium in Chapel Hill on Sunday, May 17, to close the North Carolina drive for contributions to the Kennedy Library. All persons contributing \$10 in Cleveland County will receive

tickets to the Chapel Hill event from Hamrick and members of the local committee.

Each person receiving the \$10 adult ticket may request a ticket for a child 15 years and younger at no additional cost.

Members of both political parties were appointed by Governor Sanford to sponsor the drive in North Carolina for the library which will house historic papers that came into the nation's possession during President Kennedy's term.

Democrats on the State Committee for the Kennedy Library include U. S. Senators Sam J. Ervin, Jr., and B. Everett Jordan, as well as Secretary of Commerce Luther H. Hodges and State Party Chairman W. Lunsford Crow.

Prominent North Carolina Republicans on the non-partisan State Committee for the Kennedy Library Fund are Congressman

Charles Raper Jonas, J. Herman Saxon, J. E. Brodyhill, and Federal District Judge A. L. Butler.

Sanford said it will be more meaningful for North Carolinians to make a united contribution to a major national memorial to honor the late President than it would be to name various public facilities in North Carolina for President Kennedy.

Hugh Morton, of Wilmington owner of Grandfather Mountain and Chairman of the USS North Carolina Battleship Commission, was named by Sanford as chairman of the State Committee for the Kennedy Library. G. Andrew Jones, Jr., State Budget Officer, is Treasurer for the drive which has \$230,000 for its minimum state goal.

Persons interested in purchasing tickets to the May 17 tribute to President Kennedy, or in helping in the local drive, should contact Hamrick.

Blaylock Member Of Army Exercise

CANNON AFB, N. M. Technical Sergeant Edwin J. Blaylock of Bessemer City, N. C., is participating in Exercise Delaware, a joint Iranian-U. S. military training operation being staged in Iran April 12-15.

Sergeant Blaylock, son of Mr. and Mrs. Luther Blaylock of R. 2, Bessemer City, is an Air Force legal technician with a Tactical Air Command unit here. He is one of 6,800 U. S. military personnel in the four-day Air Force-Army-Navy-Marine Corps exercise.

The sergeant's unit will help provide support for the exercise. Dubbed Delaware, Persian for "courageous", it is being conducted to develop the military defensive capabilities of the Central Treaty Organization.

Sergeant Blaylock, a graduate of Gastonia high school, received a B.A. degree from the University of Alabama. His wife, Leona, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Kavanagh of Newfoundland, Canada.

Automatic Dialer Is Now In Use

Southern Bell Telephone Company's Card Dialer automatic dialing phone, recently introduced here for business use, is now being offered in a new model for the home, F. B. Houck, Manager, announced today.

This phone automatically dials desired numbers by insertion of plastic cards on which numbers have been pre-punched initially by the user. According to Houck, the Card Dialer automatic dialing service increases the convenience, speed and accuracy of phoning.

Houck said the difference between the newest Card Dialer telephones now being offered is the line capacity. Recently introduced models for business use are equipped with six buttons which enable them to handle a number of individual telephone lines. The new model is a single line phone. Except for the absence of buttons, it is identical in appearance and operation.

Houck said the new single line Card Dialer phone also is advantageous to "one-line" small businessmen and is available to commercial customers.

The Card Dialer automatic mechanism is combined with the phone in one compact unit. White plastic dialing cards can be coded quickly with a ball point pen or similar object by punching holes in designated places for the desired number. Any number of cards can be used and space is provided in the phone itself for filing most frequently called numbers. The new model is available in all popular colors.

To call a number, the appropriate card is inserted in the phone, the receiver lifted and a start bar pushed, Houck explained. The phone "reads" the card and automatically dials the correct number.

The phone also can be dialed in the conventional manner.

"Card Dialers are especially useful in the home for women with church or club activities," Houck said, "or for anyone who calls the same numbers frequently."

It makes phoning easier and more efficient, plus eliminates the need for maintaining a personal telephone directory or special lists.

Automatic dialing also increases the speed and accuracy of long distance calling, Houck pointed out. Area code prefixes can be entered on the plastic dialing card along with a distant friend's or relative's local telephone number.

Complete information on the new single line automatic dialing telephones can be obtained by calling the telephone company business office, Houck said.

Traffic Deaths Set New High

RALEIGH—State traffic deaths for the first quarter of the year established a new high in blood letting, the Motor Vehicles Department said this week.

During the first three months, the agency listed 346 traffic victims, the highest three-month death tally ever recorded in North Carolina.

Road deaths currently are running about 33 per cent over the same period of 1963.

The agency's past records showed the worst previous year to be 1959 when 279 died; 115 were killed in January of that year, 72 in February and 92 in March.

For the current year through the end of March the official toll was 106 in January, 128 in February and 112 in March.

Last year's total traffic death count was 1381; in 1959 it was 1193.

Officials were unable to explain the marked increase in fatalities. Ordinarily, the last quarter of the year produces the heaviest harvest of tragedies, with several major holiday periods and inclement weather listed as principle causes.

"It's no real surprise for deaths to top a hundred a month during November and December," a department spokesman said. "But it's highly unusual to have it happen so early in the year."

Department records 15 years back show only two first-quarter months in which traffic deaths exceeded 100. March of 1962 had 120 fatalities and January of 1959 listed 115 dead.
