

Lutheran Synod Held Convention

KANNAPOLIS — The North Carolina Lutheran convention was told by its treasurer, Charles

Hellig of Salisbury, Tuesday that during the past 10 years the Lutheran membership in North Carolina has increased 25 per cent to 71,346 and that giving has increased 221 per cent during the same period.

Last year North Carolina Lutherans gave \$1,495,681.05 to church work.

Sixteen seminary students were presented to the Synod convention after they had been approved by an examining board.

The students, their home towns and the churches they will serve after their ordination at Rocky Mount June 14 included W. Lloyd Mitchum, Kings Mountain, Reformation, Columbia, S. C., assistant pastor.

It was a beautiful morning. The sun was shining brightly and most welcome after many days of rain. The air was fresh and fragrant with early spring blossoms.

I parked my car and was ambuling along toward the back entrance to our building when a young friend and co-worker from another department happened along on his way to work. His cadence was nearer 180 than the usual 120 or less.

I greeted him with top-o-the-morning to you, Bob, and a happyday. What's your hurry? He scheeched to a stop on his Hush Puppies and decided to take a breather and pass the "time of day" with me.

"You know," he said, "I just live in a state of rush and tension. I mow my lawn, tend my borders, prune and spray, but I don't take the time to enjoy the environment I have tried to create. It is more a matter of keeping up with the neighbors than of real enjoyment and relaxation. It is a shame, too."

I suggested that it might be wise to slow down a little before he gets butterflies in his stomach. He replied: "That is a challenge which I shall remember." I know many, many more promising young men afflicted with this scourge of the space age. How about you?

Mow, mow! mow! That has been the story in our neighborhood as far as the evergreen grasses are concerned. Once a week has not been enough in some cases. If you are also having this lush growth don't get mad and cut the blades of grass shorter than two inches. You will regret it if you do. Mow as often as needed and be thankful that you have a beautiful welcome mat for your landscape.

Some timely reminders. Insect eggs are hatching in the millions and other insects are coming out of hibernation. Be prepared for a vigorous campaign against these pests with your dust and spray programs. Same for the leaf spot and other diseases on your ornamentals and vegetable crops.

Prune your early flowering shrubs as soon as they have finished blooming, if they need pruning. After planting your warm season vegetable seed, lightly mulch with heather pine straw or clean grain straw over the rows. This will break the force of the rain drops and prevent soil compaction.
