Science Show Starts June 1 In Chapel Hill

CHAPEL HILL—The Morehead Planetarium's 1964 Summer Science spectacular, "Spaceship to the Moon," will open June 1 and continue through June, July and August, with public performances added at 3 p.m. daily.

"Spaceship to the Moon" is considered one of the most expensive and difficult astronomical program production challenges undertaken by the Planetarium since it opened 15 years ago.

The script for "Spaceship" was compiled from data furnished by the Planetarium since it opened 15 years ago.

The script for "Spaceship" was compiled from data furnished by the National Aeronautics and Administrations, and Planetarium technicians have been at work on preparations for presenting the light and sound, tape, film and "live" effects in the program since April.

Essentially "Spaceship" takes viewers to the moon on a space-

ship from Cape Kennedy, to the surface of the moon in a lunar excursion module (LEM), back to the spaceship, and back to the earth.

Included in the program are action scenes of the Mission Control Center in Houston, Texas, and where technicians monitor the activities on televiewing screens.

Also, part of the program is taped voices of astronauts describing the surface of the moon after they have landed on it.

Performances of "Spaceship to the Moon" will be given daily at 3 and 8:30 p.m. starting June 1; Saturdays at 11 a.m., 3, 4 and 8:30 p.m.; and Sundays at 2, 3, 4 and 8:30 p.m.

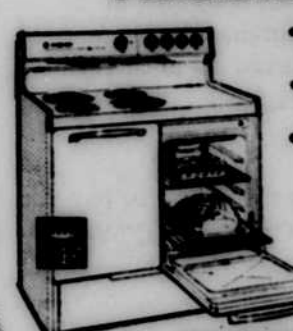

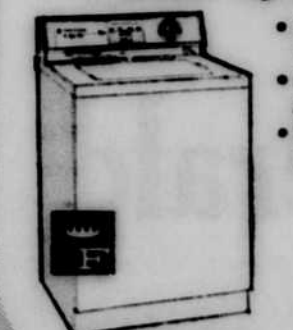
