He answered, "Young women in the Volunteers may make the rounds with public health nurses or welfare case workers, lead games and teach craft work, or furnish some love and attention to affection-hungry children in day care centers."

"College men in the Volunteers may work in construction crews to repair shanty houses. Or they may teach the rules of baseball and concepts of fair play to children from disadvantaged homes."

Harris said that Bright, who was self-employed as a septic tank engineer, left a note denying the charges filed against him.
