

### Routine Docket Aired Monday In City Court

A routine docket of cases was heard in City Recorder's Court before Judge Jack White Monday.

A two week log of cases were docketed as a result of the Court's not being in session on May 18. William D. Foster, 20, of 21 E. Gantt Street, Greenville, S. C., was found guilty of operating a motor vehicle without a proper driver's license, and displaying an improper tag. He received a 60 day sentence, suspended upon the payment of a 25 fine and the costs of court.

No estimate of the damages was reported Monday.

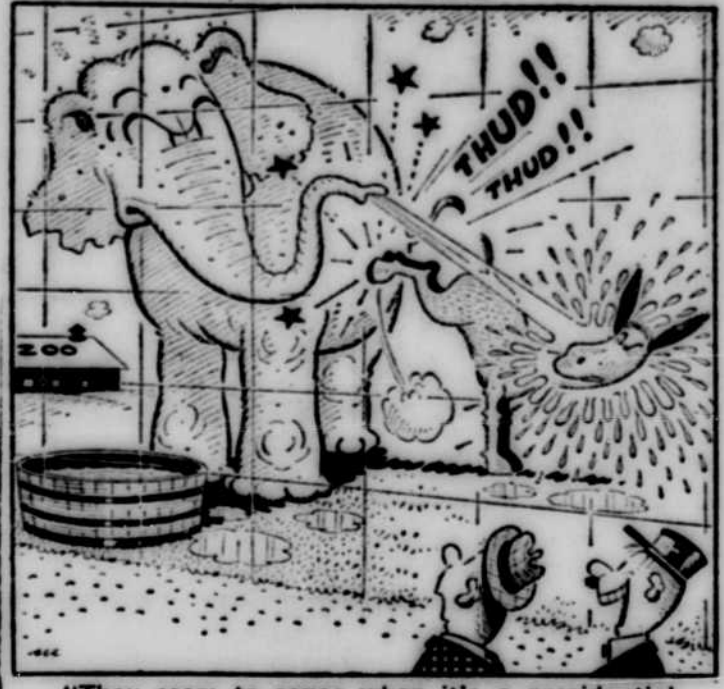

**Hot Tip**  
Here's a tip for painting a hot subject. When calculating how much paint you'll need for a room, don't forget to allow for radiators which require seven times as much paint as a similar area of the wall. The formula is simple: multiply the height of the radiator by its width and then multiply this product by seven. Divide this figure by the number of square feet a gallon of paint covers, as stated on the label. This gives you the fraction of a gallon needed to paint the radiator. Remember, however, to paint the radiator on a day when you can turn it off.

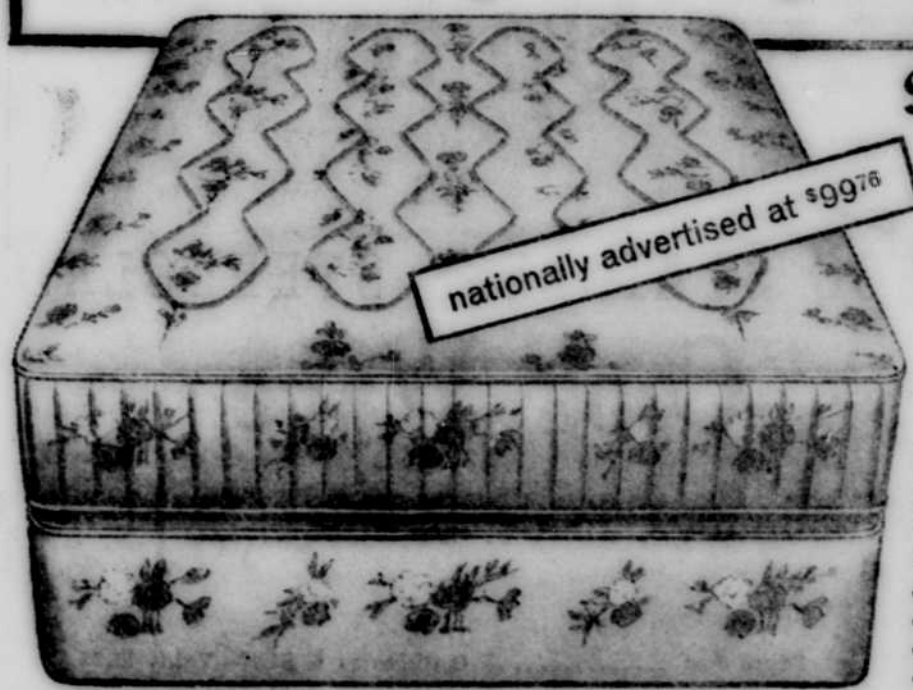

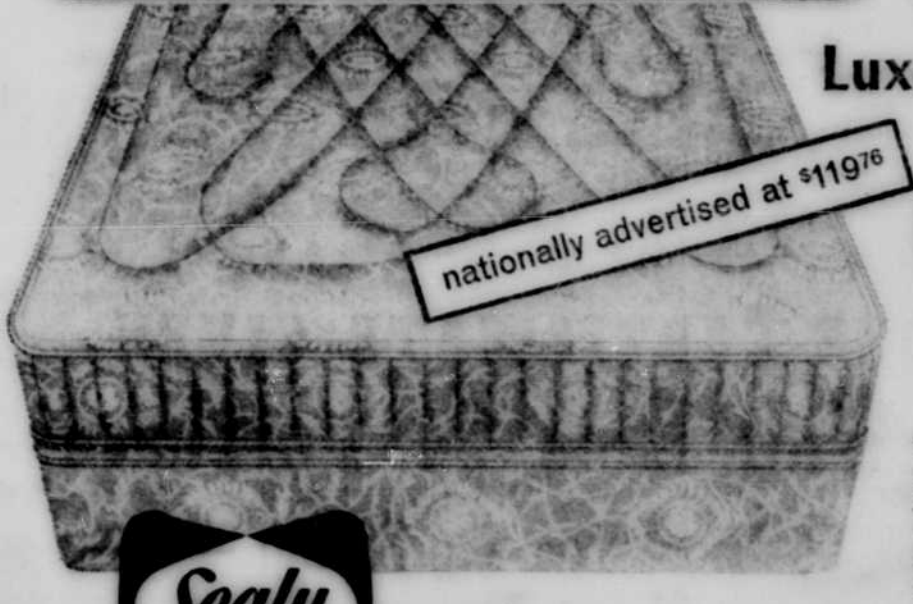
