Roberts Remains In Critical Condition
 Glenn (Fireball) Roberts, NASCAR's biggest money winner, is still listed in critical condition at Charlotte's Memorial Hospital following the Sunday accident at the Charlotte 600 late model stock car race.
 Roberts was involved in a three-car collision on the backstretch of the mile and a half

Motor Speedway early in the race. The accident, which involved veteran drivers Junior Johnson and Ned Jarrett occurred in the seventh lap of the 400-lap meet.
 Roberts, No. 2 money winner among NASCAR drivers last year, was burned over 70 per cent of his body, including 35 per cent in third-degree burns.

Houston Seeking Fourth Hickory Win In Saturday's "Ladies Night"

HICKORY, N.C. — Ken Houston will seek his fourth victory of the season at Hickory Speedway in the 50-lap NASCAR late model sportsman feature of a six-race "Ladies Night" program Saturday night.
 The lanky speedster from Conover, who leads the track point standings, steered his 1961 Ford to victory last week in a tight duel with Ervin Killian of Hickory, who finished second in a 1961 Chevrolet.
 Charles Triplett of North Wilkesboro scored his fifth victory of the season in the hobby (amateur) feature on the same program. Triplett has five wins and a second in six starts here this year.
 A field of 40 to 50 cars is expected for Saturday night's event, which is scheduled to get under way at 8:30 p.m. on the four-tenths of a mile banked clay track. As usual when women are admitted free, a new-capacity crowd of 6,000 or more is expected.
 Houston, who until this season had won only one race here, has suddenly emerged as the star of the weekly Saturday night competition for the late model sportsman division — which features 1960 and 1961 model cars with limited modifications.
 He started slowly in 1964, finishing sixth and eighth in the season's first two races. Then he stormed into the ranks of the front-runners, winning two consecutive races — including a 125-lap duel in which he edged former champion Glenn Killian of Hickory.
 Since then, the predominant element here has been the running battle between Houston's Ford and Glenn Killian's 1961 Pontiac. It was Killian first and Houston second in the next race. Homer (Burrhead) Nantz of Mooresville, in a 1961 Chevrolet, won the following event after Killian spun out of the lead.
