

### Driver "Fireball" Roberts, Better Facts Released

GLENN (FIREBALL) ROBERTS, critically burned in the May 24th World 600 late model auto race at the Charlotte Motor Speedway, continues to make slow, but sure progress toward recovery. The battle will not be an easy or a rapid one.

At this stage, his physicians will not say how long they think Roberts will be hospitalized. Meanwhile, the veteran NASCAR driver could perhaps write a book on some of the things that have happened to him since the accident. For one thing, Roberts' fan mail has been tremendously heavy. More than 5,000 letters and cards have been received during the first two weeks of his hospitalization. The mail has come from all over the world, including Germany, Mexico and Canada. One Mexican race fan suggested that Roberts take up bull fighting because "it's safer." Any number of rabbits' feet and good luck charms have come from well wishers to Roberts' Memorial Hospital room, where visitors are restricted to members of his family, and only then when Roberts asks for them.

THERE ARE SEVERAL facts about the Roberts accident which have not previously been related. According to Fireball's father, Glenn Roberts Sr., Roberts spun his car intentionally after the cars of Ned Jarrett and Junior Johnson collided at the head of the backstretch and went spinning wildly down the long, fast chute. As Mr. Roberts related, Fireball was trailing Darel Dieringer, who was a couple hundred feet behind Johnson and Jarrett. Seeing the spinning cars ahead, being partially blinded by Dier-

inger's car and not knowing whether he or Dieringer could get past without crashing, Roberts decided to spin his mount, hoping he could wind up on the apron of the track and continue in the race. Dieringer, meanwhile, has said, "I saw Johnson's car back out of the smoke and head toward the outside wall, so I closed my eyes and went under him. I couldn't see for the smoke from Jarrett's car. All I could do was hope, and I was lucky." Jarrett's car had burst into flames, and gas from his tank had set the inside of the track on fire. Roberts' car, which Dieringer said "passed me backing up," hit the end walls, flipped upside down and of a retaining wall going back-landed 28 feet from where it hit the wall. Jarrett, whose car had stopped about 30 feet beyond where Roberts' car landed, jumped out of his burning machine and assisted Roberts. Also quickly to the scene were seven track firemen, who were stationed about 30 feet from where Roberts' car landed. One fireman, Gene Deese, helped Jarrett remove Roberts' racing uniform, which was turned over to Earl Kelley, speedway promotions director.
