For the second summer, residents of Wattuga, Wilkes, and surrounding counties, who like to re-enact their ancestors' history, retrace the rugged route that Daniel Boone first followed in ening the way to the West.

Their 75-wagon expedition, under direction of Wagon Master, DeWitt Barnett of Boone and Chief Scout, Ivey Moore, of Wilkes County, rolls out of the foothills town of North Wilkesboro on June 20.


