ies each month, he pointed out. While not all these involve changes of address, a sizable portion do. The change of address process is quite simple if the person getting social security benefits will use the cards given him when an initial claim is filed.

Q—I am a farmer 63 years old. Would I be eligible to receive any social security benefits while I clear around \$1400 a year farming?
A—You would, on filing an application and qualifying, be able to receive benefits for most of the year. You should take your social security card and a copy of your latest Federal income tax return when you call at the social security office.

Q—I will be 62 in February and wish to apply for my social security benefits. Should I wait until my birthday to file my papers?
A—No. You may file your application as early as three months before you reach retirement age.

Q—I have been working for the past twenty months at house-keeping and caring for three small girls. My employer has not asked me for my social security card. He hasn't taken out any social security taxes. I receive \$30.00 a month for my work. What must I do?
A—You should talk with your employer and ask him if he is reporting your earnings to the Social Security Administration.

Q—I hired a lady to clean my house one day a week. I pay her \$10 to do this work plus 50c car fare. Is it necessary for me to pay social security taxes on the wages I pay her?
A—If you hire a domestic employee who is paid \$50 or more in cash wages during a calendar quarter, you are required to report her earnings.

Q—I have recently employed a maid to help me with my house work. When and how often do I report her earnings?
A—For reporting purposes the year has been divided into quarters. The first three months of the year compose the first quarter, etc.

Q—I have a household employee who has worked for me for the past year. I did not know that her earnings were subject to social security taxes, and I have never reported her earnings. What should I do?
A—You should visit your nearest social security office immediately, and they will make arrangements for you to report her earnings.

Q—Where can I get a report form to file social security taxes on my domestic employees?
A—You can get on the mailing list to receive the report form quarterly by contacting either the Internal Revenue office or your social security office.
