

Stretching Your Dollar

If someone gave your wife \$10,000 tax free, how would she spend it? Buy a new wardrobe? Take a trip to Europe? Move to a more expensive neighborhood? Lend it to her brother? Invest it in a friend's failing business?

Perhaps she would be more practical: She would pay off all your outstanding debts, put some in the bank, and spend the remainder on whatever she wants. Do you think that the situation would be the same if your wife were the beneficiary of your \$10,000 life insurance policy? Anyone in the life insurance business will tell you that the lonely, grief-stricken woman becomes a sensitive target for temptations of many kinds. To help your wife and family through such a situation, you can plan ahead now. Your agent can help you do this. Once needs have been determined, you can select one of these basic options offered by life insurance companies, regarding how benefits are paid to widows:

1. Lump Sum Payment
2. Yearly Benefits (Annuities)
3. Lump Sum Payment Combined with Yearly Benefits

For most Americans, I feel that (3) is the wisest choice. This option gives the widow an immediate lump sum payment to pay off final pressing expenses, while a yearly annuity affords her a budgetary supplement to other benefits, such as social security payments. Added together, this gives her a livable family budget.

Above all, don't forget to talk to your wife about which plan to use. It is unfortunate that American husbands are extremely reluctant to discuss such grim matters as life insurance and wills with their wives. If you are one of these husbands, remember that in trying to spare your wife the sadness of meeting reality, you are not getting the advantage of her point of view on these matters.

If your wife is like mine, you will be astounded to find that she will, herself, suggest the practical lump sum plus annuity plan of payment of benefits. Above all, she will welcome your discussing this problem with her.

Mail Service Is Expanded For Holidays

Longer postoffice window hours, expanded delivery services and large-scale extension of the ZIP-coded parcel post speedup are planned for Christmas, Postmaster General John A. Gronouski has advised the local Postmaster, Charles L. Alexander.

Mr. Gronouski outlined to the Kings Mountain postal head, three major new steps he has taken "for the best Christmas mail service the Postal Service

has ever had:"
1. Expanded post office window hours Dec. 5 to 26 as deemed necessary locally.

2. A six-day week, Dec. 7-31 for parcel post deliveries, instead of a five day week. As most of our patrons know, we are now delivering parcels on 5 days: Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

3. Completion by Nov. 1 of Phase III of ZIP Code parcel handling at about 130 more "sectional center" post offices (strategically located mail massing points), providing faster delivery up to 24 hours or more for parcels with ZIP Code.

In Phase I and II, approximately 75 offices with receipts of \$5 million annually and above activated faster ZIP Code sorting and dispatch by Sept. 1. The 130 in Phase III includes offices with receipts of \$1 to 5 million. In addition, many other sectional center offices with smaller receipts will have the program in operation by early December, in time to help speed delivery of Christmas gifts mailed with the ZIP Code.
