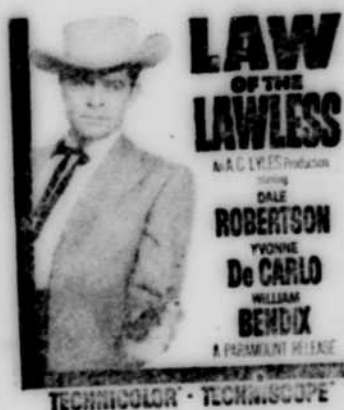

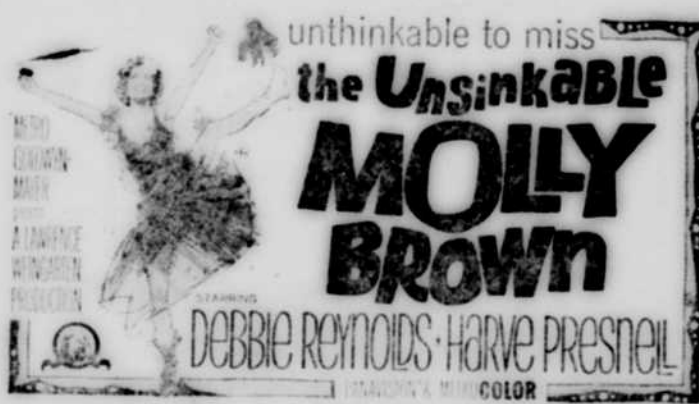

## Calvin Trull And "Pal" Moss Guilty Of Assault And Affray Charges

Calvin Trull, Jr., 26, 108 Sadie Mill and Palmer Moss, 34, Mid-pines Community, were sentenced to six months suspended upon the payment of \$35. fine and the costs of court for assault with deadly weapons and were sentenced to 30 days suspended upon the payment of \$10. and the court costs for participating in an affray in Wednesday's City Recorder's Court.

The affray began at the Silver Villa Friday night, Sept. 18. Trull stated that he stopped to make a phone call, and when he

Police officer Charlie Wallace was called to the scene by the operator of the service station, and made the arrest.

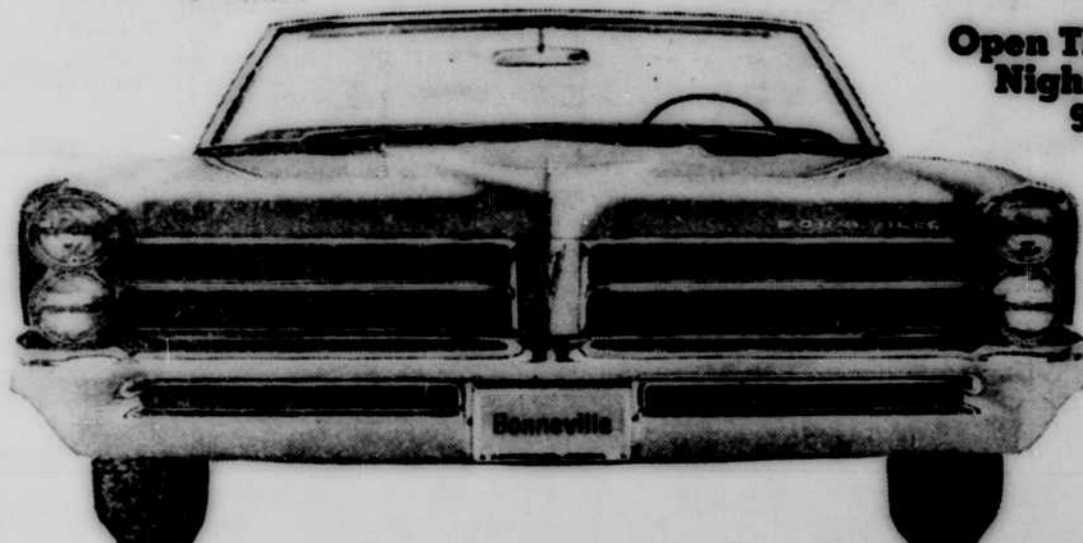

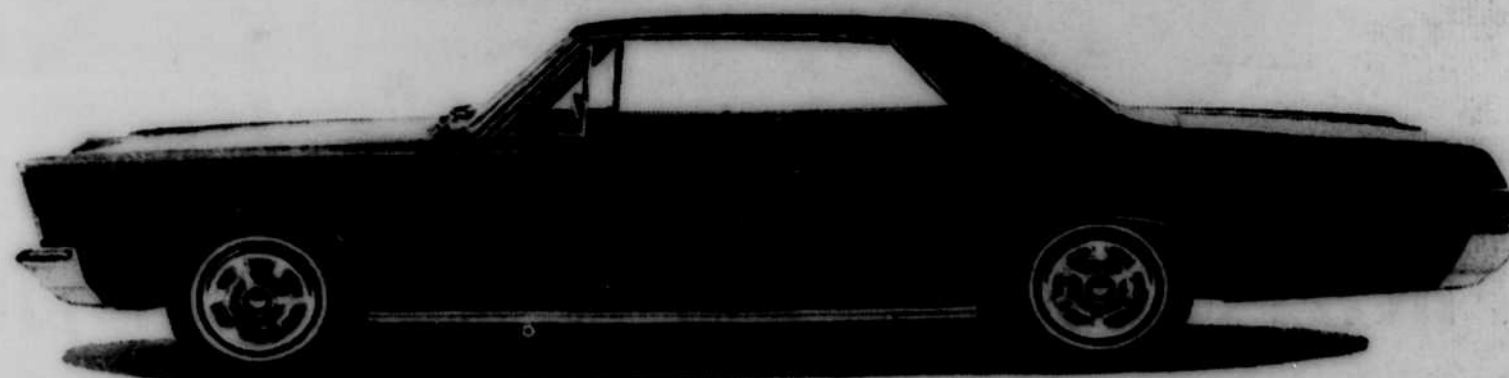

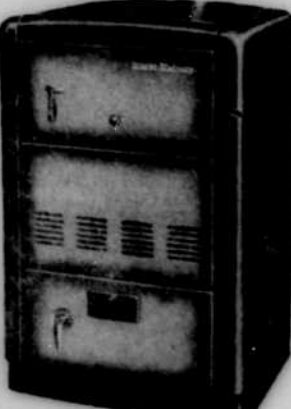
