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Agriculture In Action

GIVE AND TAKE

Uncle Sam appears to be getting more interested everyday in the give and take of life.

With one hand, he wants to give the American citizen more cash hand-outs. And, with the other hand, he wants to take more of that same citizen's hard-earned money.

Such a trend, of course, gives us cause to wonder just what Uncle Sam is up to. It just doesn't seem right, somehow, buying a man's favor and acceptance with his own money.

Already this year we've seen the creation of a new "savior" for the poor. Its a ponderous anti-poverty pilgrimage which, at the cost of billions of dollars, is somehow supposed to spend hard times clean off the face of America.

Maybe this Robin Hood episode will come out like the script writers intended (Robin Hood you recall, was that jolly gent who robbed from the rich and gave to the poor.) But the plot has some sad overtones, for charity handouts erase pride as well as poverty.

The citizen's mutilated paycheck now faces another rendering, as the government "horn of plenty" toots a beckoning fanfare in the direction of our elderly citizens.

Well, can Uncle Sam really buy prosperity? We'll be the first to admit that we have a few more pounds of hindsight than foresight. At any rate, the relief payment approach hasn't exactly enjoyed a resounding success on the farm.

Government payments to farmers in 1964 are expected to reach \$2.1 billion, or 17 per cent of an anticipated net income of \$12.3 billion. For the first five months of the year, payments totaled \$533 million—nearly one and a half times more than the \$371 million paid during the same period a year ago.

The growing dependence of farmers on government doles for their livelihood is dramatized by the fact that as recently as 1960, payments accounted for only 5.9 per cent of net farm income.
