

Long Ticket For November 3 Voters

Cleveland County citizens who go to the polls at the general election November 3 not only will help decide who will be the next president and vice-president of the United States but an unusually large number of other contests.

The larger number results from the fact that the Republican party has fielded a larger-than-customary field of candidates, both for state offices and county offices.

Outside of the presidential contests, pitting President Lyndon B. Johnson and Senator Hubert

H. Humphrey, Democrats, against Senator Barry Goldwater and Representative William Miller, Republicans, top interest attends 1, the race for the governorship between Dan K. Moore (D) and Robert M. Gavin (R), and 2) there are 10th district U. S. Congressman between Basil L. Whitener, Democratic incumbent, and W. Hall Young, Republican challenger, and 3) county offices.

Several candidates have no election worries. These include Jack H. White, of Kings Mountain, and Adrian Shuford, Jr., of Hickory, unopposed Democratic nominees for the two 31st district seats in the North Carolina Senate; Charles W. Ford, Democratic constable for Number 4 Township; J. Lee Roberts (D) and Elzie L. Putnam (R), incumbent Number 4 Township magistrates. (Both Roberts and Putnam are assured election, since the township is permitted a minimum of nine magistrates.)

Five Democrats, Bobby Aus-

tel, Buford Cline, J. D. Ellis, and two Republicans, J. R. Dover III and Marvin McCurry, in effect seek county-wide nomination to five county board of education seats. In Cleveland County, the General Assembly appoints the county board of education.

There are five contests for county offices:

For North Carolina representative — Robert Z. Falls (D) vs. Bob F. Maner (R).

For register of deeds — Ralph Tucker (D) vs. Carl W. Queen (R).

For county commissioner District 1 — Hugh Dover (D), incumbent, vs. Paul W. Seal.

For county commissioner District 2 — Coleman W. Goforth (D) vs. Joe A. Neisler, Jr. (R).

For county commissioner District 4 — Spurgeon Hewitt (D) vs. Sam Proctor (R).

State Races
Only Charles F. Carroll, superintendent of public instruction, and Frank Crane, commissioner of labor, incumbent Democrats,

have no opposition among members of the council of state.

Three Democratic candidates for Superior Court judgeships, Elbert Peel, Jr., 2nd judicial district, William A. Johnson, 11th judicial district, and John D. McConnell, 20th judicial district, are unopposed.

Robert W. Scott, Democratic nominee for lieutenant governor, is opposed by Clifford Lee Bell, Gastonia Republican.

The other races for state offices (current office holders are incumbents and Democrats):

State Auditor Henry L. Bridges vs. Everette L. Peterson.

State Treasurer Edwin Gill vs. Charles J. Mitchell.

Commissioner of Agriculture James A. Graham vs. Van S. Watson, Jr.

Commissioner of Insurance Edwin S. Lanier vs. John C. Clifford.
