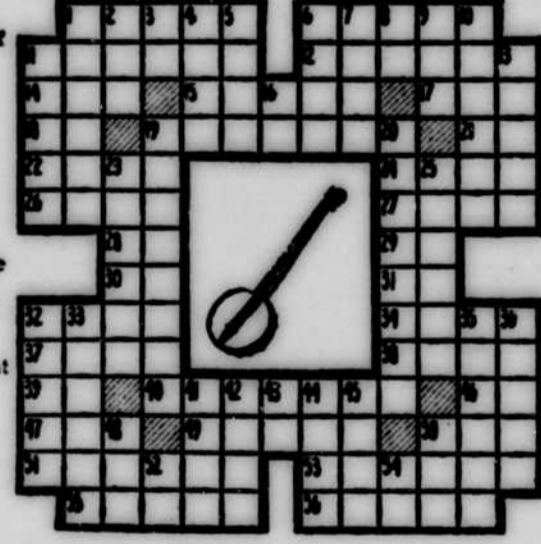

AIR ASSAULT II, FORT JACKSON, S. C. (AHTNC) — Army Specialist Five Ray K. Camp, son of Charles C. Camp, 22 Elm st., Kings Mountain, N. C., participated in pre-stage exercises at Camp Leesburg, S. C., in preparation for Exercise AIR ASSAULT II, a month-long maneuver to be conducted in the tri-state area of Georgia, North Carolina and South Carolina, from Oct. 14 to Nov. 12.

Specialist Camp and other members of the 124th Transportation Company, received training as neutral forces which will provide administrative support and technical assistance for the combat forces.

The AIR ASSAULT II exercise area will cover 4.5 million acres of privately owned land. The purpose of the field problem is to determine whether advances in light aircraft capabilities and new technology can be employed to improve battlefield mobility and combat effectiveness of U. S. ground forces.

Well, you've finally done it! You went out and bought a half side of beef at those really low prices. Now, what do you do?

- Package in quantities to be cooked at one time. If two steaks are to be wrapped together, place a double thickness of freezer paper between them so they can be separated more easily for thawing and cooking.
- Protect all cuts to be frozen by wrapping or packing them carefully in moisture and vapor-resistant materials.
- Label each package with date, kind and type of cut and weight or number of servings.
- Remember to limit the amount of food frozen at one time in a home freezer to two pounds per cubic foot of total storage space.
