Show Honors Late President

CHARLOTTE — "The Burden and The Glory of John F. Kennedy," an hour long special dedicated to the memory of the late President, was presented Wednesday, Nov. 18 at 7:30 on WB-TV, Channel 3.

This program examined the events that occurred during Mr. Kennedy's tenure. It will be narrated, in part, in the words of the late President himself and his associates.

In its examination of the events of the Kennedy years, the broadcast touched upon the President's Inaugural Address (Jan. 20, 1961); the Bay of Pigs incident and the President's subsequent speech before the American Society of Newspaper Editors (April 20, 1961); Mr. Kennedy's meeting with then Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev in Vienna and his report to the nation upon his return (June 6, 1961); the Soviet and U. S. resumption of nuclear testing in 1961 and 1962; the President's speech before the General Assembly of the United Nations ("Let us call a truce to terror," Sept. 25, 1961); the Cuban missile crisis and Mr. Kennedy's speech to the nation on the Cuba Quarantine (Oct. 22, 1962); the peace speech delivered at American University in Washington, D. C. (June 10, 1963); the announcement of the nuclear test ban treaty (July 26, 1963); and the foreign affairs speech delivered at the Salt Lake City Mormon Tabernacle (Sept. 26, 1963).

Participating, through off-screen narration, were many of the Cabinet Officers, Presidential advisers and members of Congress who worked with President Kennedy. They included Secretary of State Dean Rusk, Ambassador to the United Nations Adlai E. Stevenson, Under-Secretary of State for Political Affairs W. Averell Harriman, McGeorge Bundy, Special Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs.

Also Vice-President elect Hubert H. Humphrey; Pierre Salinger, who was President Kennedy's press secretary; Theodore C. Sorensen, who served as special counsel to the President and Allen W. Dulles, former head of
