RALEIGH — Those who get ahead have a clear vision of the road they must travel to their goal, and this principle applies to safe winter driving too, says Motor Vehicles Commissioner Ted Scheidt.

"No matter how bad the weather he faces, the defensive-minded driver has a pretty good chance of reaching his destination, because he has the tools to do the job and the intelligence to drive properly," he explained.

"His tools include a windshield wiper blade that clean the glass of sleet and snow, a defroster that keeps the windshield from fogging over, a slightly opened vent or window for proper ventilation and headlights that show the way ahead clearly under darkest conditions," Scheidt pointed out.

erate the use of dried-up wiper blades and weak arms which smear or are only half effective. The cost of replacing old blades with new, live rubber refills, or adjusting blade arms to proper strength, is so small that it's utterly foolhardy to neglect making this decision for safety's sake.
