STRETCHING YOUR DOLLARS

I have often been asked if mutual funds can serve as a substitute for life insurance. Since many of these investment plans have enjoyed dazzling successes, the question is provocative, but the answer is still very basic.

Although both can make important financial contributions to a person's security, life insurance offers that rare opportunity for immediate certainty. As you know, there are few things in life which are certain, least of all life itself. In no other situation can the payment of a single premium, even a monthly one as low as \$5.00, produce an estate of \$10,000 overnight.

The moment you make the first payment on your insurance policy, your family is certain to receive the specified amount you purchased. This extraordinary protection is only available through life insurance.

This, I strongly feel, should be the primary concern of any family man.

What about mutual funds? Mutual funds, because of the diversification of holdings and professional management, are among the safest type of investment plans offered to the public. Further, many of them have yielded excellent results to their owners in the past. The likelihood is that they could continue to be a minimum risk investment which will produce both income and growth for their participants. However, there are no guarantees.

I have always stressed what I call the "PSI-ology" of financial planning: Protection - Savings - Investment - in that order.

PROTECTION: There should be adequate life insurance protection for a man's family, in case he dies. This is his first responsibility. The likelihood is that very few of us can ever provide, totally through life insurance, what we feel our family would need. However, by emphasizing protection as the first order of personal business, we have taken the first step towards security. This should be insurance totaling a minimum of 5 years of income.

SAVINGS: At the same time a man is developing protection through life insurance, he should establish an organized savings program. Cash value in whole life insurance is one form of savings, but a systematic plan for saving, bank or government bond purchase could be the second step in a planned financial program.

INVESTMENT: Only when he has established substantial life insurance protection, and accumulated cash savings equal to 24 months of his salary, should a man think of investing.

At this point the mutual fund is an ideal solution for most, since it provides the benefit of professional management for the investment of your money.

erred by the program will make his own decision about whether to take part. The program is available for corn, grain sorghum, and barley. Farmers who participate in the program will be eligible for diversion and price-support payments, and for price-support loans on their entire 1965 production of the three grains. The price-support payments will be made to participants whether the feed grain produced in 1965 is fed on the farm, sold, or placed under a price-support loan.

To take part in the feed grain program, the farmer will agree to take out of production and devote to an approved conservation use at least 25 percent of the total feed grain base. Maximum diversion is 50 percent of the base or 25 acres if this is larger. The reduction may be on any of the three acreages, and the diversion payment will be based on the crop diverted.

The sign-up period will be for seven weeks, from February 8 through March 26. During the sign-up period, winter wheat producers who signed up in the wheat program last fall may change their intentions. As in previous years, the feed grain program will be voluntary and each operator of farms growing one of the three feed grains cov-
