Garden Time

The house plants should be carefully watched during February as insect pests become more active. Seven will control practically all of these pests except spider mites. For mites, use malathion.

Some plants may have become root-bound and need to be repotted using larger containers. If this be the case, here is a good soil mixture: one part coarse clean sand; two parts good loamy soil; one part peat moss, or well decomposed compost; one-half part dehydrated cow manure; one quart of bone meal to each bushel of the mixture. All of these are by volume, not weight.

Perhaps I should say something more about the kind of sand to use. You may already know that the addition of sand to the potting mixture provides good aeration (oxygen to the roots). If the sand is too fine it will serve no useful purpose. For our greenhouses, we buy what the sand and gravel people call

"concrete" sand rather than "plaster" sand. The concrete sand is much coarser, clean, and gives good results.

Provide good drainage when repotting and use clean containers. Drainage may be provided by using gravel in the bottom of the container or by placing a piece of broken clay pot over the drainage hole. Pots may be cleaned by scrubbing with a detergent, or better, by boiling.

In the lower Piedmont and the Coastal Plain it is time to plant some of the cool season crops: beets, spinach, Irish potatoes, radishes, English peas, lettuce, kale and onion sets.

If you haven't pruned those neglected fruit trees and bunch

grape vines, you had better get this job behind you. A thorough spraying with white insecticide strength lime sulfur would help. This is a combination spray as it is effective against both scale insects and thrips.

Reader response to "Garden Time" has been very good. Hope that you will write me when I still one of the best all-around winter clean-up sprays. It may be purchased in either liquid or

powder form and should be mixed with water as follows: liquid six gallons to 50 gallons of water; powder 15 pounds to 50 gallons of water.

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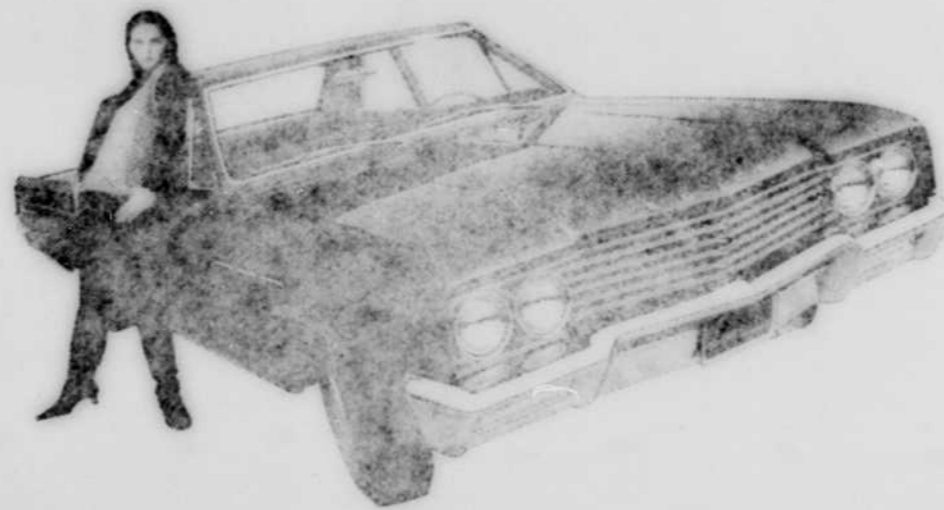


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
