Fireman McKee At Convention

Winston-Salem — T. C. McKee of the Kings Mountain Fire Department attended the 37th annual Fire College.

For five days, May 24-28, firemen and industrial representatives from all areas of North Carolina and neighboring states received instructions and study of the latest fire control methods. Over 500 firemen and industrial representatives attended.

The School was under the direction of C. L. Cox, Chief of the Durham Fire Department and Assistant Directors, Chief C. W. Wyrick, Greensboro North Carolina Fire Department and Sherman A. Pickard, Director of Fire & Rescue Service Division, N. C. Department of Insurance, Raleigh, N. C. It was sponsored by the North Carolina State Firemen's Association, Chief G. E. Summerlin, Jr. of the Mount Olive Fire Department is President.

The Industrial Fire Protection Division consists of a 30-hour course covering Sprinklers, Industrial Fire Problems, First Aid

Fire Fighting Appliance, Setting Up and Organizing Industrial Fire Brigades and High Hazard Operations in Industry, preparing safety engineers and fire protection engineers to handle any particular problems. This course was directed by Mr. Joe Bachtler, Senior Fire Instructor at the University of Maryland. Mr. Bachtler directed this section last year at Charlotte with many favorable reports as to the results of his teachings.

Other divisions of the school were Fire Rescue, Sprinklers, and Structural Fire Fighting.

Instructors for the School come from the various Fire Departments over the state, each providing specialized instruction in Fire Control.

L. C. Williams, Chief of the Winston-Salem Fire Department was the Host Chief.

Fireman McKee invites area industrial plants interested in setting up fire brigades to contact him about the program.

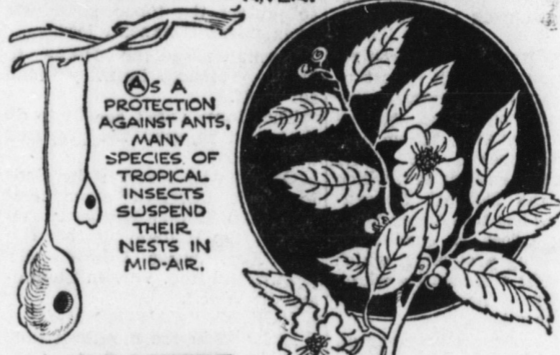

Board Awards Carpet Contract

The Kings Mountain board of education awarded contract to the low bidder, North Carolina Seating Company, for carpeting for the new high school plant during a called meeting Tuesday.

Bidders were: the low bidder at \$5749.24; Warner Flooring Co., Inc. at \$5872; and Timms Furniture of Kings Mountain at \$6074.27.

The board stipulated that 40 ounce wool mats be used instead of foam rubber.

In other actions, the board:

1) upon motion of James E. Herndon, seconded by Mrs. Lena W. McGill, authorized Architect T. W. Cottrill to seek bids for a walk-in freezer and specified kitchen equipment for the new high school.

2) Supt. E. N. Barnes reported the possibility of obtaining equipment for vocational department with the state paying one-half the cost. Upon motion of James E. Herndon, seconded by H. O. Williams, the superintendent was authorized to purchase the equipment.

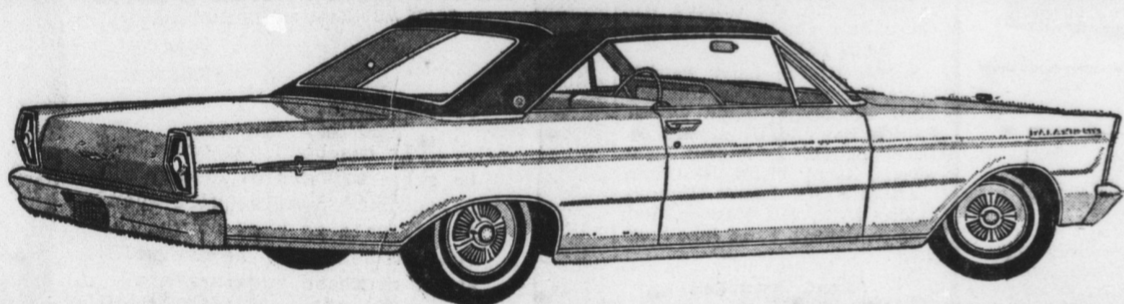

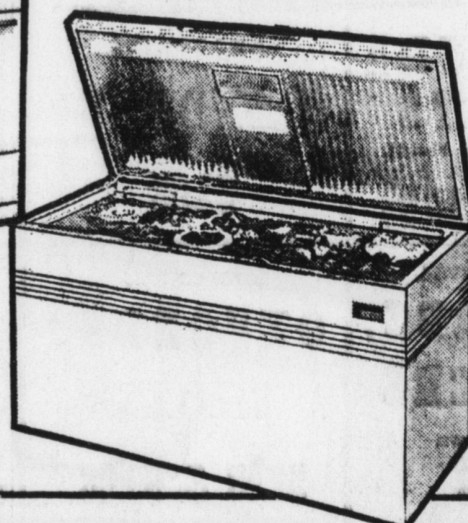
