Reserve Seeks New Recruits

The Naval Reserve Surface Division in Shelby, North Carolina has once again been allowed to enlist or re-enlist as many men as they can recruit. The unit desires new recruits who wish to satisfy their military service obligations by joining the Navy, or ex-Navy men who have not yet reached age forty-five.

Recruits must be 17 years of age and a senior in high school. Others, over 17, must not have passed their twenty-seventh birthday. Recruits will remain at the Shelby unit for one year—meeting once a week—and then serve two years of active duty with the Navy. After their tour of duty they may want to re-enlist.

For all who enlist or re-enlist there are only two obligations—they must attend drills once a week, and go to a Navy base or ship for two weeks each year for training. Regular Navy pay is received for each drill attended and for each training duty period. For newly enlisted men they

must still serve two years in the active Navy of course.

Ex-Navy men of World War II or of the Korean Conflict are eligible to "join-up" again and be a part of the New Navy. Each man will be given the rate he came out of the Navy with and paid accordingly.

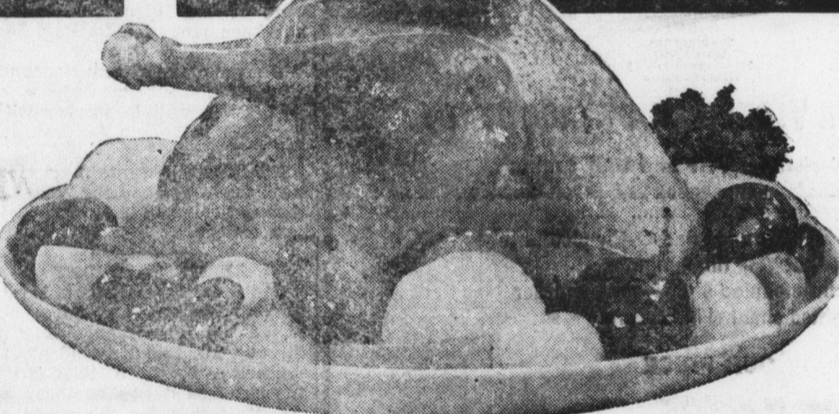
