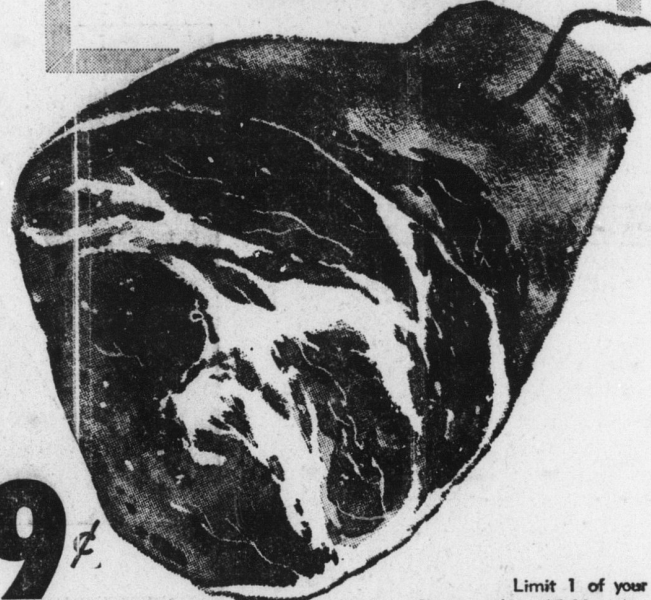

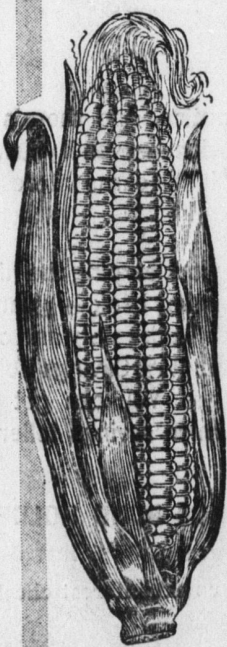

VAROOM... Let's confirm here and now what a lot of observers have already guessed—motorcycles are all over the place!

In the first six months of the year the breed has increased its own kind 20 per cent over 1964, and is at the starting line of what officials call a "beginning boom."

Motorcycles and their counterparts, scooters and motorbikes, currently total 10,863 and who can predict where it will end.

There were only slightly over 9000 two wheelers registered for the entire year 1964.

The implications of the motorcycle boom are of concern to those with official responsibilities in traffic safety.

Whether valid or exaggerated an impression exists that motorcycling is a dangerous business. Records of the Motor Vehicles Department throw some light on the subject—beauty or beast?

Serving hem up cold turkey: Accident involvement is not as high for motorcycle as with automobiles.

But if you are in a motorcycle accident there's a nine to one chance you'll be injured.

In a car the injury rate is less than 35 per cent.

The fatality rate for motorcycles is three per cent compared to 1.23 per cent in an auto.

One side says they are great because of utility, fuel economy low upkeep and ease of parking

Others contend they are in variably ridden irresponsibly, are hard to see, noisy and under any circumstances a nuisance.
