Jack Pinkelton was dismissed from the Kings Mountain hospi-

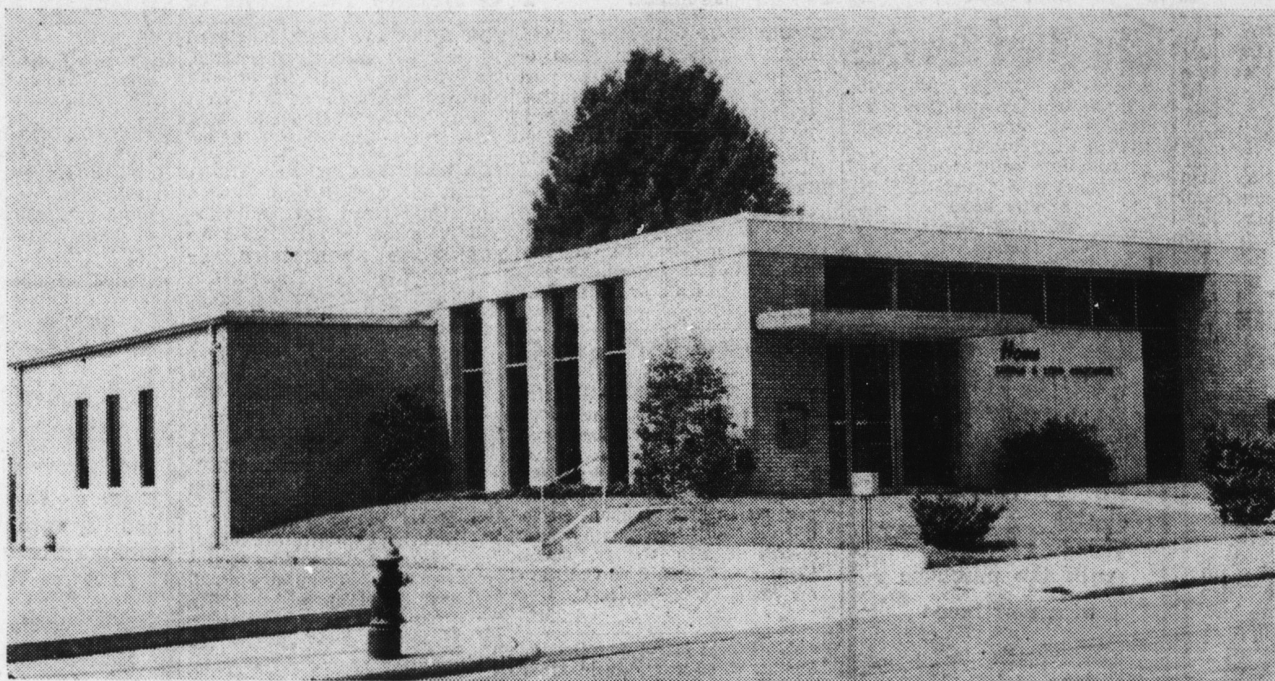

Heart Fund Gifts \$651,000

GREENSBORO — Receipts of the 1965 Heart Fund campaign in North Carolina totaled more than \$651,000. Mrs. J. Spencer Love, of Greensboro, state chairman of drive reports.
These returns, which do not include bequest income, represent a 19 percent increase over the 1964 campaign tally of more than \$547,000. Receipts of the annual fundraising effort of the North Carolina Heart Association and its local chapters and divisions were less than \$200,000 in 1955 but have climbed steadily each year since that time.
Heart Fund receipts this year exceeded receipts of any other voluntary health agency in North Carolina. This year's Heart Fund gain represents the second largest campaign gain in the United States, with only California Heart Association showing a larger increase over 1964.
Final national receipts of the American Heart Association, of which the state organizations are affiliates, are expected to top \$34 million this year.

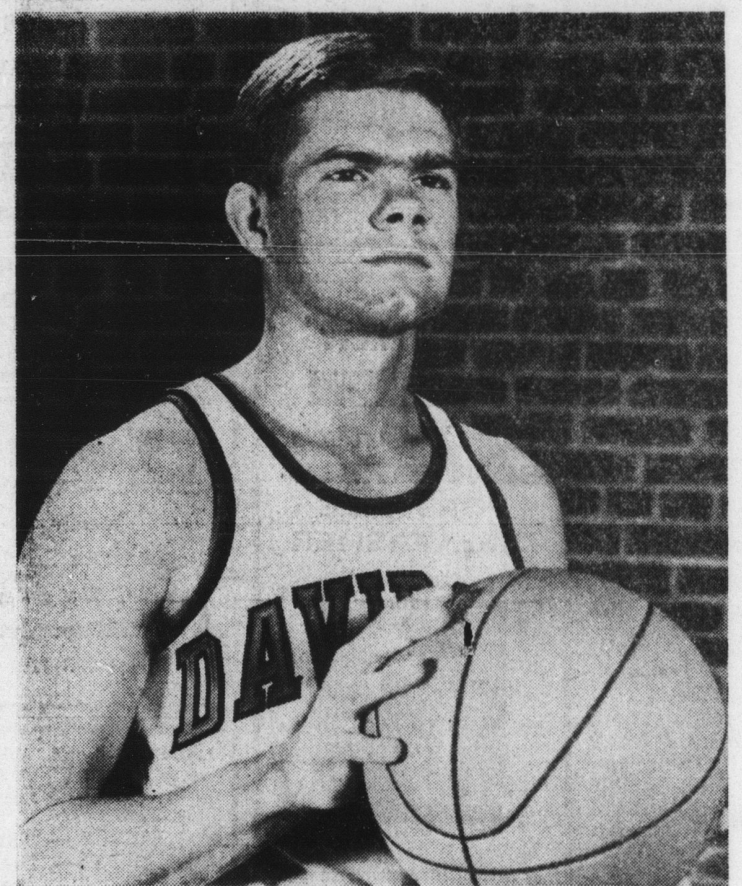
