SOCIAL SECURITY

Q—I am a widow 58 years old and disabled. Am I entitled to social security?

A—You are entitled to disability insurance benefits if: (1) you have social security credits from your own work for at least 5 years during the 10 year period ending at the time you became disabled; (2) you have an injury or illness which is expected to continue for a long and indefinite time; and (3) your illness or injury keeps you from doing any substantial gainful work.

Q—You are entitled to mother's benefits if: (1) your husband had enough social security credits to establish either or fully insured status, and (2) if you have a child in your care entitled to benefits.

Q—Is it true that Social Security uses a man's high five years to figure his benefits?

A—Only if you were born in or before 1899 (if a woman) or in or before 1896 (if a man). Leaflet No. 855 tells you how you can figure the amount of your earnings—using five easy steps. (It's free).

Q—Here is a question heard occasionally—no matter what the benefit... "how do you expect me to live on that?"

A—The Social Security program was designed to provide only a floor protection against the basic risks of old-age, death, and disability—a partial replacement of earnings to be supplemented by individual thrift, private pensions, and private insurance.

Shelby Wins Teener Title At Belmont

The Shelby Teener Leaguers defeated Calhoun, Georgia, 8-0 this morning to capture the Southeastern Regional Teener League title and to advance to the Teener League World Series which will be played in Hershey, Pennsylvania, August 15-20. The Southeastern tournament was played at Belmont Abbey College in Belmont.

Shelby will represent the Southeast in the tournaments. Shelby won the berth by defeating Greeneville, Tennessee, twice by scores of 8-1 and 9-1 and by downing Calhoun, Ga., by scores of 8-3 and 8-0. Shelby was defeated by Georgia 1-0 in the two teams first outing Monday afternoon.

Shelby won the North Carolina Teener title in Greenville two

weeks ago by defeating Gastonia, Kings Mountain, who went to the semi-finals of the state tournament before losing out to Gastonia, was beaten once by Shelby, 2-1.
