Savings Bonds Quiz

Q—I bought Series E Bonds planning to hold them for 17 years and nine months. What will my tax liability be, and when must I pay?

A-Series E Bonds you buy today have an initial maturity per-iod of seven years and nine iod of seven years and nine months, but carry an automatic 10-year extension option, which makes them 17 3/4 year Bonds. Federal income tax on interest may be reported annually if you so elect—but most people choose to defer payment of tax until the bonds are redeemed. There is no state or local income tax on interest.

Q-Can a refund be obtained on a Savings Bond bought in connection with a chain-letter scheme which, I understand, is illegal?

A—You are correct in your understanding that such schemes are illegal. However, if you learn of the illegality after the purchase of the bond, you may be able to get a refund. You should obtain, fill in and file Form PD 2966 (revised June, 1962), usualty available at your bank or at ly available at your bank or at any Federal Reserve Bank or branch.

Q-Is it permissible to use Savings Bonds as an award in a

contest? A-The Treasury Department encourages the use of Savings Bonds and Stamps as prizes in contests of knowledge or skill such as quizzes, slogan competitions and the like. But it definite ly disapproves the use of Bonds or Stamps in connection with lotteries, punch-boards, pin-ball games and similar games of


