

Census Bureau Asking Farmers About Number Of Television Sets

Families in this area will be asked about ownership of television sets during the August Current Population Survey by the Bureau of the Census, according to Director Joseph R. Nonwood of the Bureau's Regional Office in Charlotte.

The Advertising Research Foundation and the Federal Communications Commission have requested the TV information in addition to the regular inquiries on employment and un-

employment asked by the Bureau each month to furnish information for the U. S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics.

The TV questions will be aimed at determining:

1. If the sample family owns a television set.
2. Number of sets in the household.
3. If the household has color

TV.

4. If it has ultra high frequency TV (Channels 14 to 83) and the type of UHF receiver if there is one.

A similar survey done in May 1964, showed that 93 percent of U. S. households had television sets at that time. No questions were asked about color or UHF television in the 1964 survey.

The information will be col-

lected during the work week starting August 15 from scientifically selected sample households in this area as well as other sample areas throughout the U. S.
