

Golden Knights To Appear Here

Free-falling parachutists of the world famous "Golden Knights," the official U.S. Army Parachute Team will be demonstrating their aerobic skill here during Mountaineer Days October 8-9, it was announced by Joe Vale.

Word was received from the team's home base, Fort Bragg, N. C., that the eleven man team has been scheduled to appear on two days of the week-long battle anniversary celebration in an area just west of the city limits, the location to be determined by a jump team after the team reviews aerial photographs made here last weekend.

Since the Golden Knights organization in 1959, the Army's aerial ambassadors have staged over 500 demonstrations of free fall parachuting throughout the world. As a part of the Continental Army Command the Knights have three basic jobs; demonstrations, competition and research development. To accomplish all these missions, the 49-man U.S. Army Parachute Team is broken down into separate sections. This summer, while the Team's demonstrators are presenting their aerial maneuvers, their team mates are competing in National and International parachute meets.

In competitive parachuting circles, the Knights are also recognized as the world's finest. They have produced four United States Champions, three World Champions, one Helms Foundation Sport Parachute Athlete of the Year and numerous runners-up since 1959. These same championship techniques will be shown here as the Knights leap from their aircraft at 13,500 ft. During four 75 second free falls, they will perform individual maneuvers, two-man aerobatics and a final four man formation. Colorful smoke trails come from specially constructed foot-mounted smoke bombs. The trials allow the spectator to watch the action with ease. At the end of each series of falls, the chutists pull their ripcords and open their parachutes. Black and gold nylon canopies blossom out and the jumpers steer the highly maneuverable parachutes to landings in front of the spectators.

In addition to the nine parachutists who will be visiting here during the Battle of Kings Mountain celebration, the Golden Knights also have a narrator and a ground control specialist.

Speed Entries In Needlework For State Fair

RALEIGH — With only a few weeks left before the opening of the N. C. State Fair, knitter and chocheters who plan to use their needle or hook to win fame by entering the 1965 National Wool Needlework Contest, are urged to let their fingers fly.

To be eligible as a contestant, articles must be entered not later than Friday, Oct. 8 at 6:00 p. m. Judging of the knitted and crocheted entries is scheduled to begin Monday, Oct. 11. The contest is being sponsored jointly by the National Hand Knitting Yarn Association and the American Wool Council for the third successive year.

Mrs. Ruby Miller, Extension clothing specialist at N. C. State University at Raleigh, says careful attention should be given to blocking, cleanliness and overall details before presenting the entries for judging.

Both knitters and crocheters are eligible to enter the contest, provided they are non-professional needleworkers. Awards will be made in six categories, three each for knitting and crocheting. These categories include afghans, sweaters and three-piece baby sets.

First place blue ribbons will be awarded in all six categories and a handsome engraved trophy will be awarded to one of the six blue ribbon winners adjudged to be "Best of the Fair".

All six first place winners at the Fair will be eligible to submit their winning designs to national headquarters in New York where they will be judged in competition with other blue ribbon winners from fairs throughout the country.

In addition to the blue ribbon presentations there will be second and third place ribbons awarded in all six categories.
