

Poppy Day To Be Saturday

Poppy Day is Saturday in Kings Mountain and members of the American Legion Post 155 Aux- Mayor John H. Moss, in sign-

ing a proclamation designating Saturday as Poppy Day. "The hearts of all our citizens in the Kings Mountain area will be with this commendable effort this year as a means of paying tribute to all our war dead," the mayor declared. "This community is fully cognizant of the great contributions and great sacrifices made by the members of the armed forces and on this day each year we have an opportunity of paying our humble respects to those gallant Americans who laid down their lives in order that we may continue to enjoy the blessing of freedom."

"It is also an opportunity for all of us to pay tribute to those brave men and women who still live as victims of the wars," the mayor continued. "The funds collected by the American Legion Auxiliary and all other volunteers are used to aid the many veterans still in hospitals and to assist the fatherless children and the widows of the war dead."

"Poppy Day should be one of solemn remembrance for all of us in the county, keeping in mind always those courageous souls who laid down their lives in order that we may live in peace and prosperity," Mayor Moss said. "It constitutes a debt which we can never pay—but all of us can, in a small way, show our appreciation by wearing the right scarlet blossom of remembrance on Poppy Day Saturday."

"Therefore, I do declare Saturday, May 28, to be Poppy Day in the city of Kings Mountain and urge all our citizens to join in his worthwhile observance by wearing the memorial flower," the mayor stated. Directing the Poppy Day activities here will be Mrs. Robert Morrison, chairman, for the Post 155 Unit of the American Legion Auxiliary.

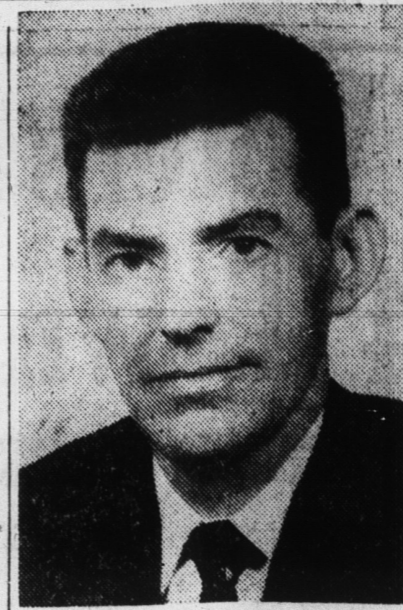
Poppy Day originated some 45 years ago as a simple and sincere method of paying tribute to the war dead of the nation, said Mrs. Morrison.

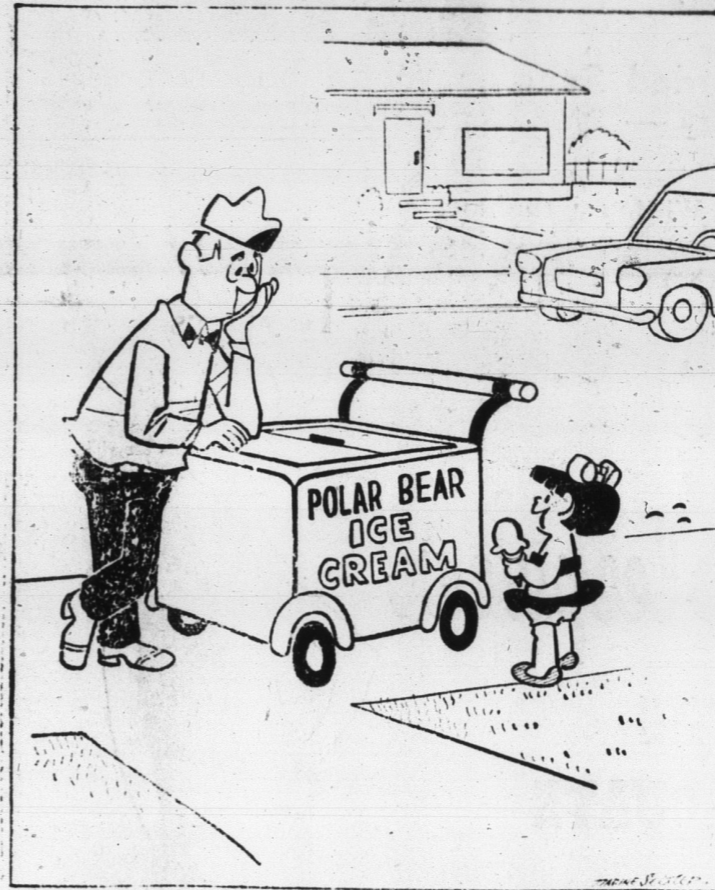

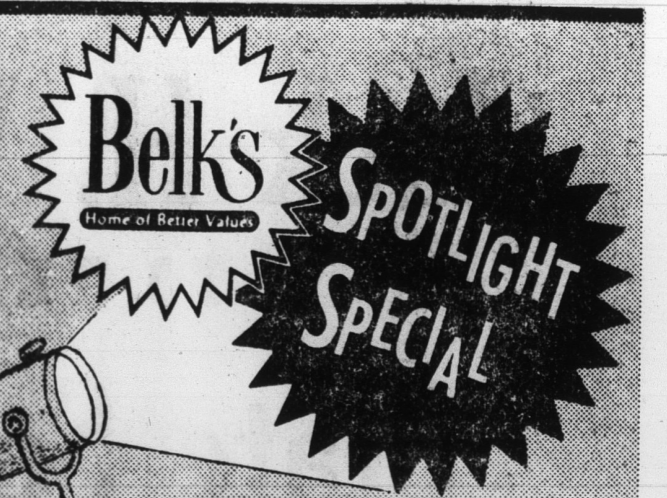

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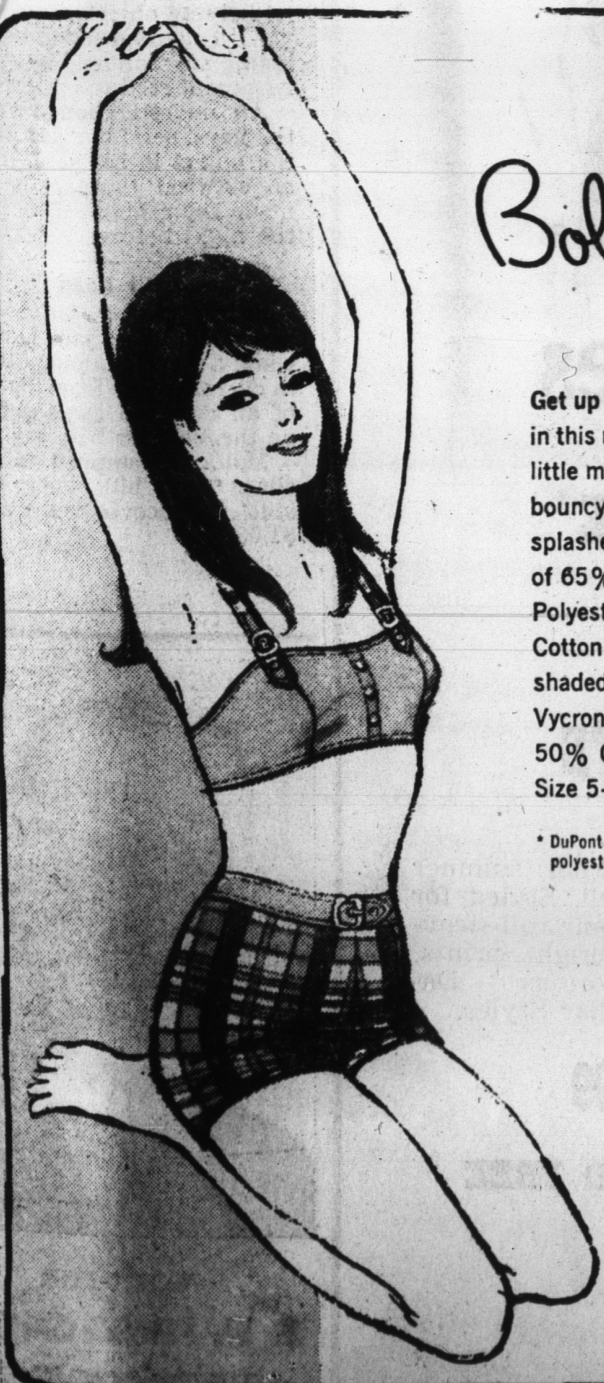
