Shanon is granddaughter of Mr. and Mrs. W. D. Greene of Kings Mountain and H. H. Harrill of Campobello, S. C.

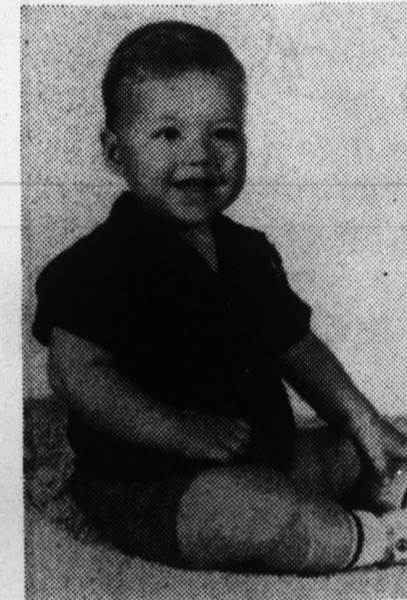
About This N' That
