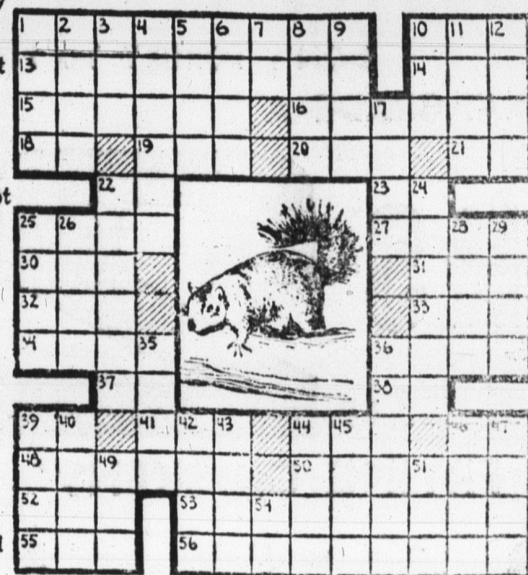

### The Veterans Corner

EDITOR'S NOTE: Below are authoritative answers by the Veterans Administration to some of the many current questions from former servicemen and their families. Further information on veterans benefits may be obtained at any VA office.

Q—Will VA guarantee a business loan under the new GI Bill?

A—No. Business loans are not authorized. GI loans may be made for the purchase of homes, farms, farm supplies or equipment, or to obtain farm working capital; also to make alterations, repairs or improvements in homes already owned and occupied; or, to refinance delinquent indebtedness on the property.

Q—Can the so-called "six-month enlistees" take advantage of the educational provisions of the new GI Bill?

A—No. Six month enlistees, national guard reservists and those who go on active duty for training purposes only are not eligible for the benefits of the new GI Bill.

Q—In 1918 I suffered TB and was sent to a Naval Hospital from which I was discharged a year later with a 100 per cent temporary total service-connected disability. In 1942 I was told
