FRENCH WOMEN FAVOR FAMILY PLANNING

Paris, France (WMNS) - Of 1,013 women admitted to the maternity ward of the Grange-Blanche Hospital in Lyons, 45 percent of the mothers told researchers that they would have preferred not having the child.

Of women questioned during and after pregnancy, 85 to 95 percent favored taking the pill. The attitude toward contraception varies somewhat depending on the number of children a woman has had; ninety percent of women having their child want to have additional children. Only 33 percent of women who have had two children want more offspring. The figure falls to 11.2 percent when she has had three children.

In largely Catholic France, only 2.5 percent of the women oppose the oral contraceptive on religious grounds. Almost 65 percent of the women said that "they had already used contraceptives" at one time or another.

Savings Bonds Quiz

For the sixth consecutive month U. S. Savings Bonds sales have shown an increase over comparable months of 1965. Sales during August totaled \$4,563,113 and were up 4.4 percent over August of last year. Bond sales were the largest recorded for August since 1945.

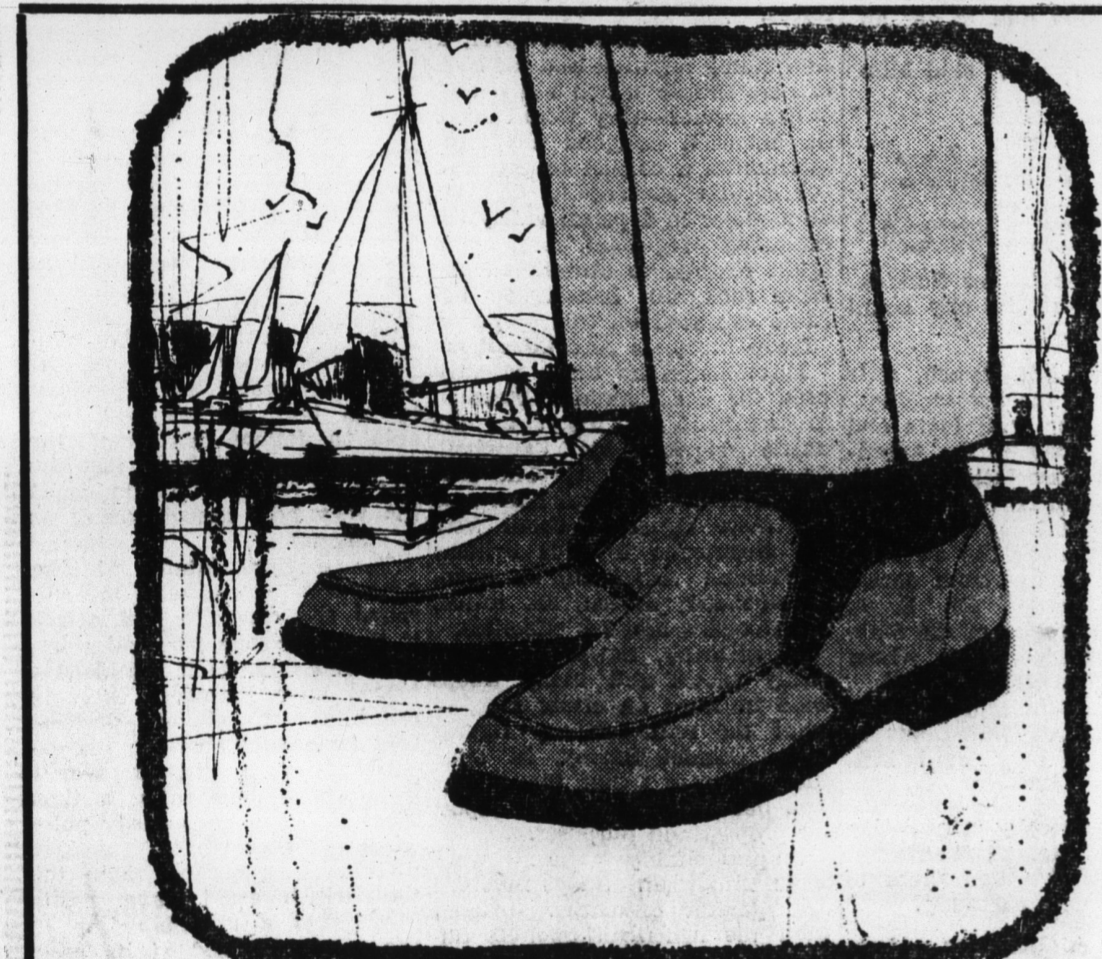
Savings Bonds sold during August in Cleveland County amounted to \$36,896, according to Mr. George Blanton, Jr., Cleveland County Volunteer Chairman. January - August sales in the County totaled \$311,639. This is 73.4 percent of the County's goal of \$424,800 for 1966.

E Bond sales for August were up 8.8 per cent, while H Bond sales were down 57.1 per cent. Cumulative Savings Bonds for January - August totaled \$36,661,661, which is nearly 6 per cent above sales for the same
