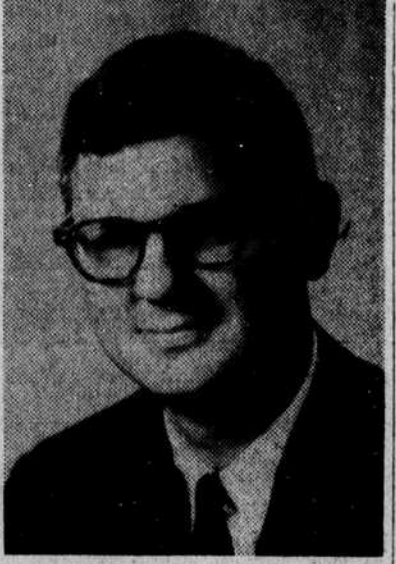

Budget Includes 1966-67 Surplus Of \$182,552

The city anticipates record income and expenditures of \$1,331,037.06 up \$10,550 for fiscal year 1967-68, with no change in the ad valorem tax rate of 85 cents per \$100 valuation.

City commissioners Tuesday night approved the tentative budget and are expected to formally adopt the budget and set the tax rate on July 25th.

Major item of anticipated income, as is customary, is from power and water sales estimated at \$660,000. The city has an unappropriated surplus from the previous year of \$182,552.27 and expects to receive \$41,168.44 from Powell Bill gas funds for street work.

EXPENDITURES

A total of \$337,217.50 is earmarked for capital improvements with \$157,742 for street department equipment, paving and curb and gutter installations.
