

### Dial One Number To Report Fire

Starting today one telephone number can be dialed to report a fire anywhere in Cleveland County.

The number is 482-4422.

To report a fire inside the city limits of Shelby, Kings Mountain and Boiling Springs, residents should still use the appropriate number listed in the telephone directory.

482-4422 can be dialed to report all other fires to the Bethlehem, Boiling Springs Rural, Casar, Cleveland County, Fallston, Grover, Lawndale, Polkville, Shanhai and Waco Volunteer Fire Departments.

The new phone is attended 24 hours a day the year round and the person on duty will dispatch the nearest fire department immediately.

One big advantage in using this new fire reporting system will be the speed in getting assistance to you.

Best piece of equipment be out on call, the person on duty can immediately dispatch the next closest department.

To report a fire:

1. Give name and telephone number first. No other information will be taken until we have the name and telephone number of the person calling.
  2. Give information as to what type of fire or emergency—grass fire, woods fire, house fire, etc. State if anyone is trapped in the fire.
  3. Give exact location—highway number, road number, near what church, school, or fire department.
- All these things will help us give you faster service and save much more property and lives.

### Count-In P-TA Program Set

RALEIGH—Count-In for PTA. Schools across the state will be staging a mass count-in for PTA during the month of October. Governor Dan K. Moore met today with state PTA Membership Chairman, Farrell Roberts of Burlington, N. C. and proclaimed October, PTA Membership month in North Carolina. Governor Moore stated in his proclamation:

I am pleased to call attention of the citizens of North Carolina to the continuing need for a close relationship between home and school. The moral support given teachers by parents and the understanding between them that is so necessary for the benefit of the students both are benefits derived from membership in the North Carolina Congress of Parents and Teachers. The Congress is to be highly commended for efforts to increase its membership throughout the state.

Students or prospective students in the Kings Mountain area should be alerted to the possibility of fraud or misrepresentation by some out-of-state and correspondence schools. The most obvious sales trick is the statement that you have been chosen from a large group, and that you will lose your opportunity if you do not act quickly. Acting quickly usually entails making a rather large, non-refundable deposit. Any reliable company or school will welcome an investigation by the prospective student before he makes his deposit. School officials annually receive brochures from the State Department of Public Instruction listing approved schools including ICS, locally represented. Anyone considering a course should check with school officials, the Better Business Bureau or the Chamber of Commerce in the community where the school is located.

Many of the schools may be perfectly reliable, but for reasons of cost, geographic location or unrealistic claims for their graduates, may prove unfeasible for the needs of the individual student.

Typical of the approaches used by the salesmen is the test. Often a test that anyone could pass is administered. The individual is flattered on his results and told that the salesman will leave the
