

### "Our Town" To Be Staged At G-W College

BOILING SPRINGS — Thornton Wilder's Pulitzer Prize winning **OUR TOWN** will be presented Thursday, Friday and Saturday at the E. B. Hamrick Auditorium at Gardner-Webb College.

The 8 p.m. performance each evening will feature actor-in-residence Herbert Woofier of Washington, D. C. Woofier works with Gardner-Webb College students under the direction of C. Robert Jones, head of the college's drama department.

The world-famous play about life in a small New England town in the early years of this century is a beautiful and moving theatrical experience.

A cast of 23 will present the play with several area persons involved. Among these are Darrell M. Allison of Boiling Springs, Brenda Crosby of Boiling Springs,

Gerald Grigg of Fallston, and Charles and Ronald Mack, both of Boiling Springs. The latter two are the sons of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Mack and are students at Boiling Springs School. Charles is in the seventh grade and Ronald is in the fourth grade.

Ronald Young of Concord, plays Dr. Gibbs, the role which is next in importance to the Stage Manager role played by Woofier. Young is a sophomore major who won the "Best Actor" award last year for his performance in **THE MIRACLE WORKER** and **QUEENS OF FRANCE**. He also played Henry Albrerton, the Shakespearean actor, in the Shelby Community Theater presentation, **THE FANTASTICKS**. Young has also appeared in **REBEL WITHOUT A CAUSE**, **THE BOOR**, **LOOK HOMEWARD ANGEL** and is the author of **FOR US ONE ELSE**, a one-act play.

The first performance of **OUR TOWN** took place at the McCarter Theater in Princeton, N. J. in 1938, and in that same year it was produced in New York at the Henry Miller Theater.

Q. I have a part-time maid. Must I report her earnings and pay social security tax?

A. If you pay a household employee as much as \$50 in a calendar quarter, you must report the earnings.

Q. I am age 62 and still working. Should I file for social security benefits now?

A. It depends on what benefits you could now receive. We would need to know your earnings and figure your benefit rate. Contact your social security office so this can be determined and you can decide what is best for you.

Q. Can every person age 72 or over now receive a social security check?

A. Most persons receiving a benefit from some other Government agency cannot also receive the special age 72 benefit. Get in touch with your social security office for complete details.

Q. I am age 63 and earning over \$1200 per year. Can I receive any social security benefits?

A. You can receive all of your social security benefits if your earnings do not exceed \$1500. You may be due some benefits if your earnings are over \$1500. Check with your social security office and find out if you are due any benefits.

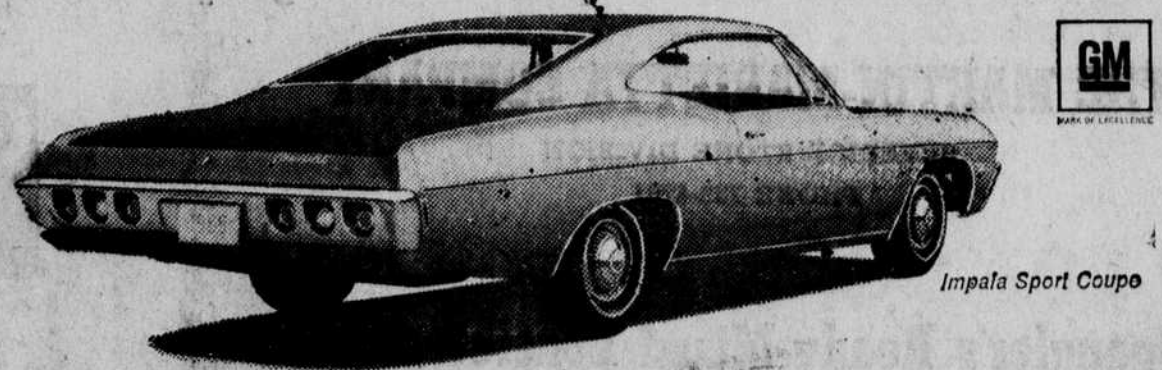

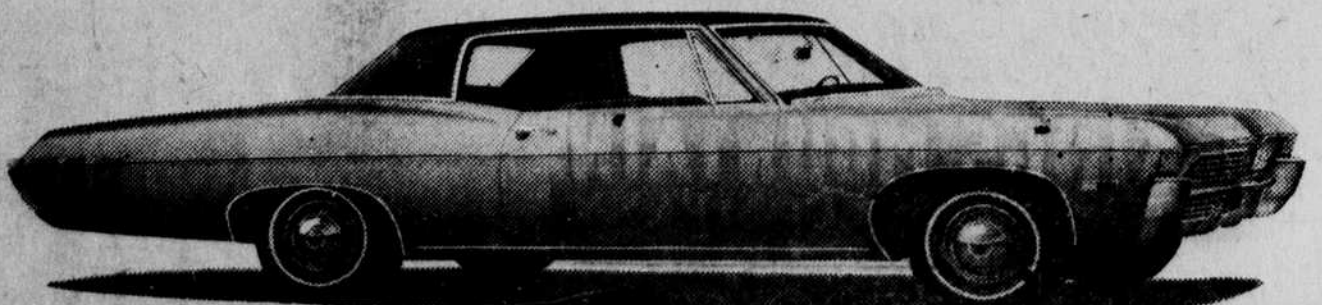
