NOTICE OF INTENTION OF APPLY TO THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT COMMISSION FOR APPROVAL OF BONDS

Notice is hereby given on intention of the undersigned to file application with the Local Government Commission Raleigh, North Carolina, for its approval of the issuance of the following proposed bonds of the City of Kings Mountain, North Carolina, which bonds shall be subject to the approval of the voters of said city at an election.

\$3,000,000 WATER BONDS

For the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for the development of a new water supply for the City of Kings Mountain on Buffalo Creek which includes the construction of a dam and impounding basin, raw water pumping facilities, a water treatment plant with the necessary pumping equipment. Pipe line from the treatment plant to the distribution system of the city, and the acquisition of the necessary lands and rights of way.

This notice was first published on the 21st day of September, 1967. Any citizen or taxpayer objecting to the issuance of all or any of said bonds may file with the Local Government Commission a verified statement setting forth his objections as provided in Section 159-7.1 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, in which event he shall also file a copy of such statement with the undersigned, at any time within ten days from and after such first publication. A copy of this notice must be attached to the statement so filed. Objections set forth in said statement shall be for consideration by said Commission in its determination of whether or not it may hold a public hearing as provided by law on the matter of issuance of said bonds.
