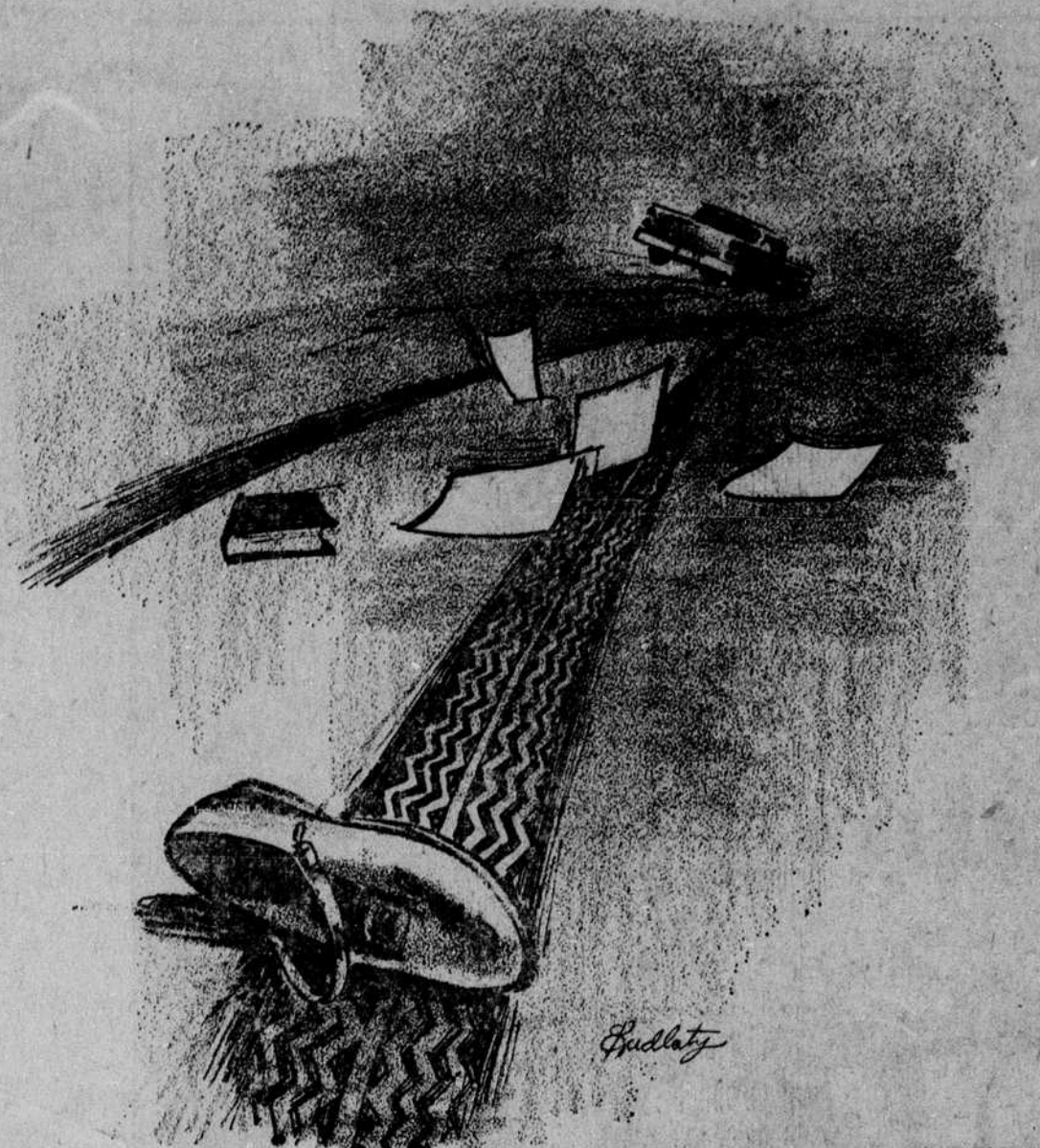

Baseball: Year-Round Sport?

BELMONT, N. C. — "October madness" is what some sports writers call the World Series, coming up in two weeks. Taking a cue from the major leagues, Belmont Abbey College will have its own "October madness" here

Bridges Injured In Practice

Eddie Bridges, 18, son of Mr. and Mrs. Glee Bridges of 602 Hillside Drive, Kings Mountain, has sustained a knee injury in a practice session at Appalachian State University.

Bridges, a freshman at Appalachian, played four years of high school football at Kings Mountain, starting at tackle and defensive guard.

Bridges has been in the Gaston Memorial Hospital for over a week now recuperating from an operation performed by Dr. Miller of the Roberts, Miller, and King Clinic in Gastonia.

He will be out for the rest of the season but hopefully he will

be back in the game next year.

He is still in the hospital and may be there for as much as another week. This will cause him to have to drop out of school for one quarter to let the torn ligaments in his knee heal.

Bridges started practice on a Saturday and was injured on Wednesday of the following week. He is in a cast from the waist down which should be removed in about six weeks.
