MEN'S CLASS

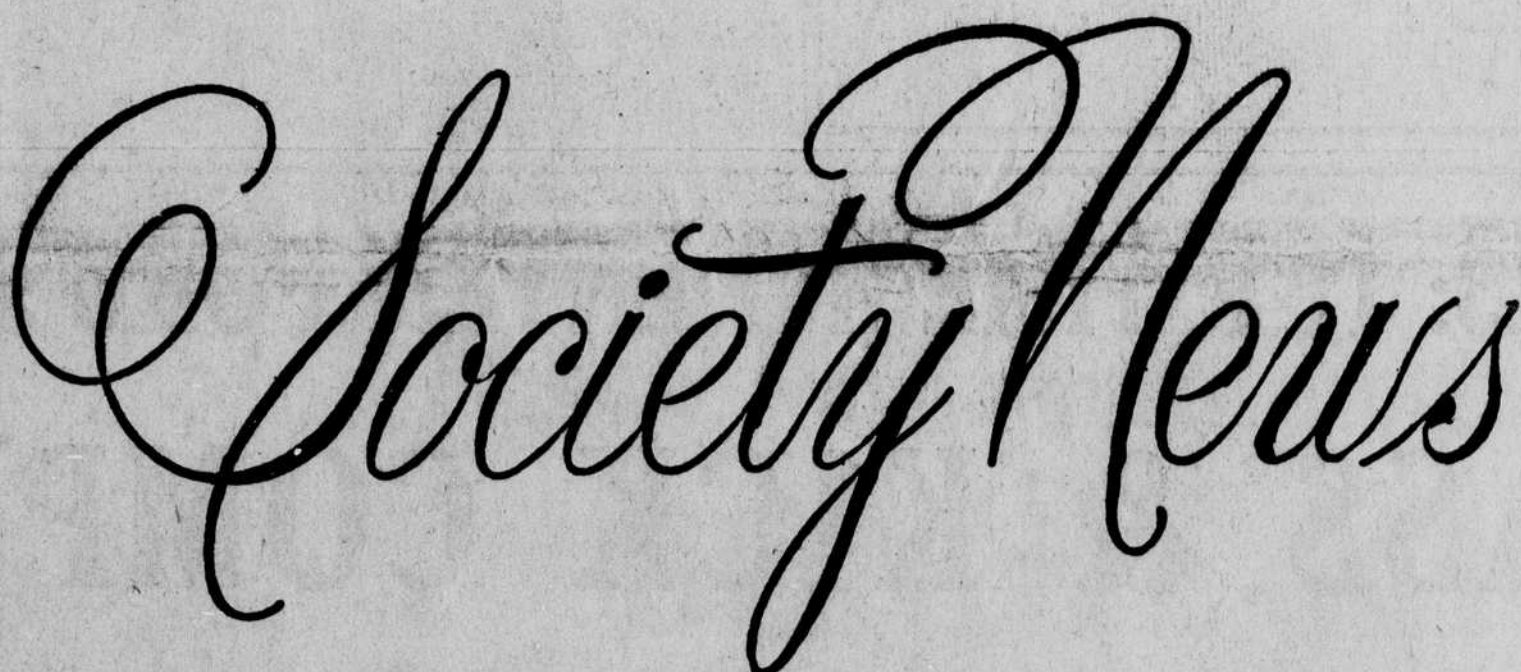
The Men's Class of Grace Methodist church will sponsor a hot dog sale Saturday in the church fellowship building.
