Fight Grease Fire With Baking Soda

To guard against the danger of a grease fire, on or in a stove, it's a good idea to keep a plentiful supply of baking soda on hand.

Burning grease will not be extinguished by throwing water on it, says the American Insurance Association.

The best remedy, after first turning off the heat, is to throw baking soda on the burning grease. Another recommended method is to place a large, flat cover over the pan, using a long handled fork to set it in place.

In order to prevent this type of fire, the Association suggests that broilers, ovens and top-of-stove burners be kept free of grease, and that grease containers be



Q. I had a heart attack and don't believe that I will be able to return to work. I have a wife and two children. If I start drawing disability benefits will my family draw, too?

A. Yes. Your wife and children could qualify for benefits under the same conditions as if you had reached retirement age.

Q. I contracted an incurable disease last summer. I am 35 years of age. How many work credits will I need to qualify for disability benefits?

A. You need 20 quarters of coverage (roughly 5 years) which you must have earned during the 10-year period just before you be-

placed far from stoves. In 1966, home fires took the lives of 6,700 people. Proper safety precautions could have prevented much of this tragic loss.

came disabled. For example, if you were disabled in 1966 your 5 years of work credits must have been earned during the 10-year period 1956-1966.

Q. My husband had a stroke last month and will not be able to return to work. When should he apply for disability benefits?

A. He should file an application now. By filing early he can help us get a prompt decision on his claim.

Q. I started drawing retirement benefits last year when I reached 65. I am now disabled. Can I get disability payments?

A. No. Disability payments are not made to a person who is 65 or over. Retirement payments are made instead.

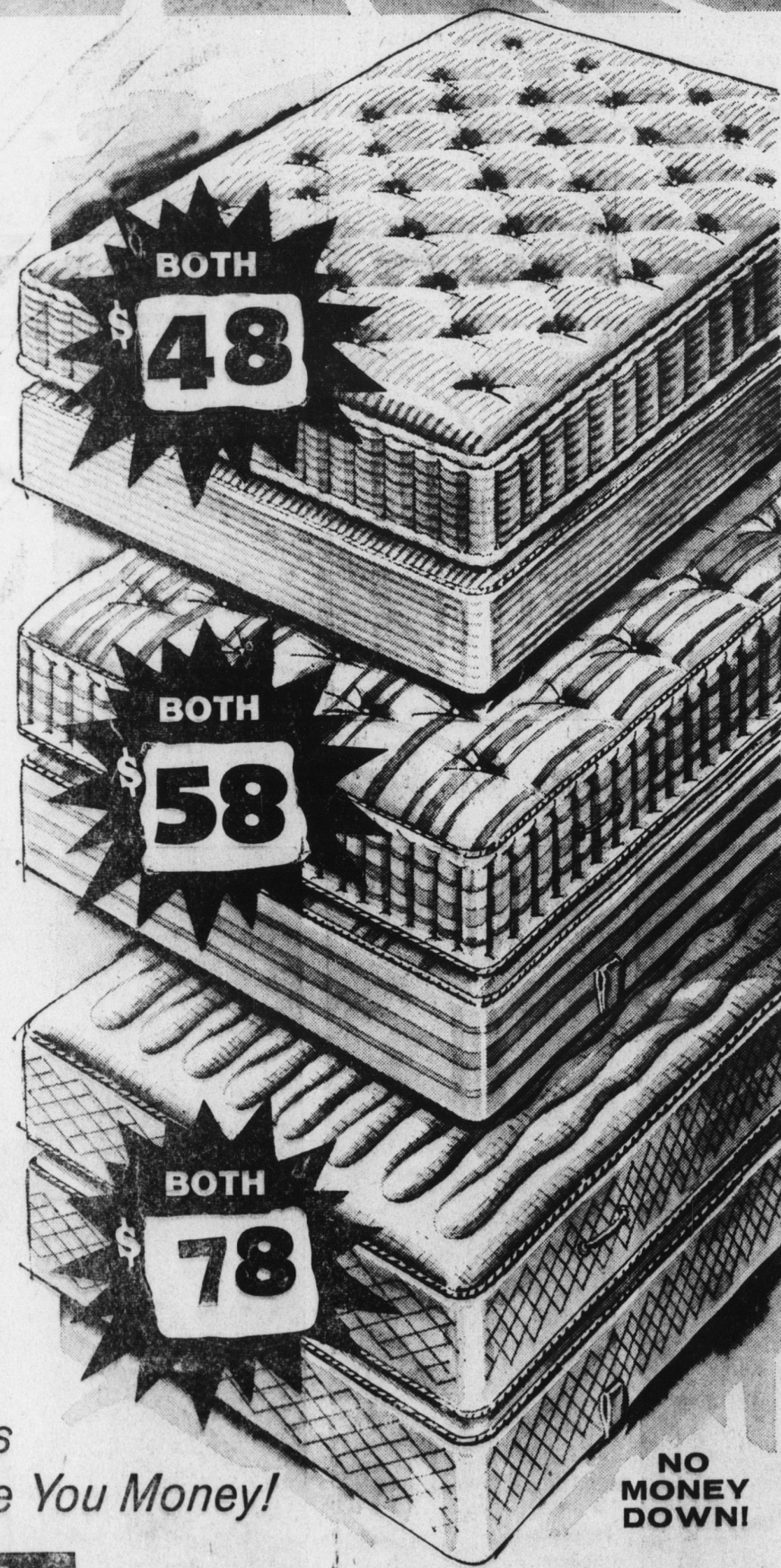
