Six Kings Mountain youths were charged and convicted of larceny of one loaf of bread from Harris Teeter. They were James Blanton, 112 N. City St., Junior Turner, 117 Wells St., Donald Paysour, 121 Bridges St., Mike Blanton, 129 McGinnis St., Robert Blanton, 112 City St., and Mike Goins, 803 First St. Turner and Paysour plead guilty. The court ruled that each of the other boys were just as guilty and the same sentence would apply to all six youths. The boys were put under one year probation with the following conditions: Each shall be in school or employed regularly, none shall enter pool room for stated period, shall be home by 9 weekdays and 11 weekends, license revoked, and each to pay court costs. The judge stated that if any condition is violated a four months active sentence would take effect.

Seven Kings Mountain men were charged with illegal gambling inside the city limits January 28. They were: Leonard Wright, Gary Canipe, Paul Tonny, Harold Broome, Thurman Gantt, Pete Marrow, and Corky Raines. Canipe, Wright and Gantt were found not guilty of the charge. Blanton Attends Two-Day Meet

CHAPEL HILL — Charles D. Blanton, Jr. of Kings Mountain was among the pharmacist-delegates attending a 2-day seminar in Chapel Hill on "The Pharmacist's Role in Mental Health".

The seminar, sponsored by the N. C. Pharmaceutical Association in cooperation with the UNC School of Pharmacy and the N. C. Department of Mental Health, covered a diverse program ranging from the symptoms of mental disease and the language of mental health to drug usage and legal and ethical controls in mental health.

Dr. Arthur J. Prange, Jr., Associate Director of Research Development at the University Psychiatric Center, Chapel Hill, said the potent drugs acting primarily on the mind have been the major reason why mental hospitals have experienced a steady decline in the number of patients during the last decade.

An unhappy footnote to an otherwise rosy report on the progress against mental illness was added: "No one knows why," Dr. Prange remarked, "but in recent years mental hospitalization of teenagers has increased about three times as fast as in the general population."

David Boheler Wins Promotion

FT. BRAGG, N. C. (AHTNC)—David S. Boheler, son of Mr. and Mrs. Haskel L. Boheler, Route 2, Kings Mountain, N. C., was promoted to Army private pay grade E-2 upon completion of basic combat training at Ft. Bragg, N. C., Jan. 10.

The promotions were awarded two months earlier than is customary under an Army policy providing incentive for outstanding trainees. As many as half the trainees in each training cycle are eligible for the early promotion, based on scores attained during range firing, high score on the physical combat proficiency test, military bearing and leadership potential.

Johnson Finishes Recruit Training

Marine Private Jimmy W. Johnson, son of Mrs. Lela A. Johnson of 700 W. Mountain St., Kings Mountain, N. C., was graduated from eight weeks of recruit training at the Marine Corps Recruit Depot here.

He will undergo from two to four weeks of individual combat training and then, after leave at home, will report to his first Marine Corps Assignment.

The intensified Marine recruit training emphasizes rigid physical conditioning and survival techniques, both at sea and ashore, to develop self-confidence and endurance. Marksmanship with the M-14 rifle and 45-caliber pistol are equally stressed, and close order drill instills the traditions of Marine Corps teamwork.

A thorough study of basic military subjects, hygiene, first aid and sanitation, and the customs, courtesies, history and mission of the Marine Corps serve to polish the new Marine's recruit education and prepare him to join the Marine combat forces.

Record Sales By Burlington

NEW YORK — Burlington Industries, Inc. today reported record consolidated net sales of \$391,716,000 for the quarter ended December 30, 1967, an increase of 16% compared to sales of \$337,700,000 for the same period last year.

Net earnings for the quarter increased 24% to \$20,032,000, equal to 79 cents per share on 25,322,900 shares outstanding at December 30. For the comparable quarter last year, net earnings were \$16,146,000 or 64 cents per share.

Charles F. Myers, Jr., president, said the results were in line with earlier expectations that textile demand was recovering from generally depressed market conditions of last year. "We have experienced a marked increase in business since last September in most areas of operations," he stated, "and we expect the improvement to continue in our second fiscal quarter."

The Board of Directors of Burlington Industries, meeting in New York today, declared a regular quarterly dividend of 30 cents per share, payable March 1, 1968, to shareholders of record at the close of business February 1, 1968.
