The school choice form lists the names, locations and grades offered for each school. The reasons for any
choice made are not to be stated. The form ask for the

whether the form has been signed by the student or parent. Any letter or other written communication which
identifies the student and the school he wishes to at-
tend will be deemed just as valid as if submitted on the choice form supplied by the school system. The names
of students and the schools they choose or are assigned
to under the plan will not be made public by school ofCourse and Program Information
All of our elementary schools have the same cur-
riculum. Every effort has been made to keep the schools on an equal basis.
Special Education classes are given in only one
school. Students that qualify for these classes should
be enrolled in that school. Mark special education on the
choice form. Signing the Choice Forms
A choice form may be signed by a parent or other
adult person acting as parent. A student who has reachA choice form may be signed by a parent or other
adult person acting as parent. A student who has reach-
ed the age of 15 at the time of choice may sign his own
choice form. The student's choice shall be controlling
unless a different choice is exercised by his parents beunless a different choice is exercised by his parents be-
fore the end of the period during which the student exer-
cises his choice. Processing of Choices
No choice will be denied for any reason other than
overcrowding. In cases where granting all choices for
any school would cause overcrowding, the students overcrowding. In cases where granting althe students

ed to that school. Whenever a choice is to be denied,
overcrowding will be determined by a uniform standard

Choices Once Made Cannot Be Altered
changed, even though the choice period has not ended. The choice is binding for the entire school year to which it applies, except in the case of (1) compelling
hardship, (2) change of residence to a place where another school is closer, (3) the availability of a school designed to fit the special needs of a physically handicapped student, (4) the availability at another school
of a course of study required by the student, which is not available at the school chosen.
All Other Aspects of Schools Desegregated activities and programs are open to all on a desegregat ed basis. A student attending school for the first time on a d desegregated basis may not be subject to any disqualification or waiting period for participation in ac-
tivities and programs, including athletics, which might
otherwise apply because he is a transfer student. All
