

INTERIM APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE
 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF KINGS MOUNTAIN:
 SECTION I
 THAT IN ORDER TO OPERATE THE CITY OF KINGS MOUNTAIN FROM JULY 1, 1968 TO THE DATE OF THE ADOPTION OF THE 1968-69 BUDGET ORDINANCE, APPROPRIATIONS ARE HEREBY MADE FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING SALARIES, THE PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST ON INDEBTEDNESS, AND THE USUAL ORDINARY EXPENSES OF THE CITY AT THE SAME RATE OF EXPENDITURES AS PROVIDED FOR IN THE BUDGET FOR THE 1967-68 FISCAL YEAR. THIS ORDINANCE SHALL CEASE TO BE EFFECTIVE FROM AND AFTER THE ADOPTION OF THE 1968-69 BUDGET ORDINANCE AND ALL EXPENDITURES MADE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ADOPTION OF THE 1967-68 BUDGET ORDINANCE
 ADOPTED THIS 25TH DAY OF JUNE 1968.

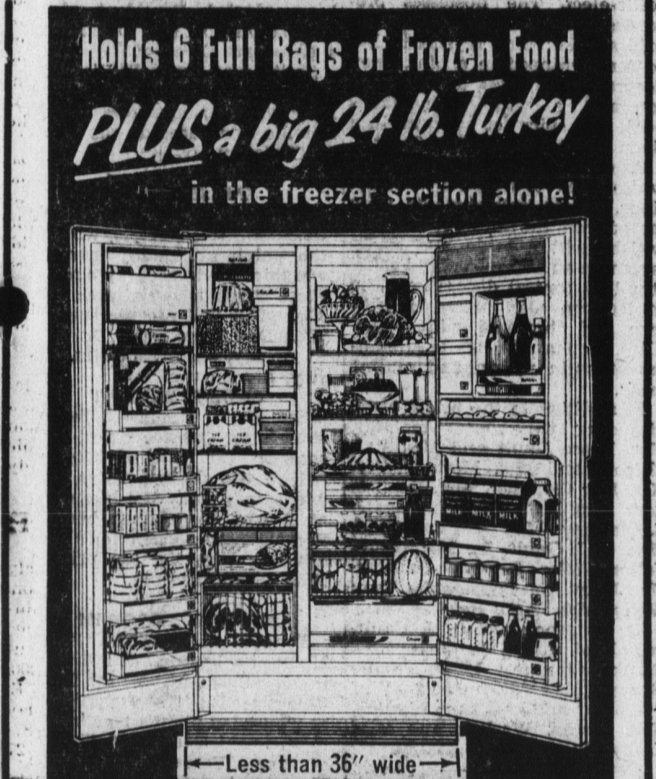
