Mrs. Dixon Co-Chairman For UNC-G Drive

GREENSBORO — Mrs. Donald Dixon, 407 Phifer Road, Kings Mountain and Mrs. Drew Evans, 816 Parkwood Road, Shelby, have been appointed co-chairmen for Cleveland County to head the 1968-69 Annual Giving Program of the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

The appointment was made by Mrs. Robert T. Bridges of Greensboro, chairman of the Alumni Annual Giving Council.

Mrs. Dixon and Mrs. Evans with other UNC-G alumni leaders in the county will set up an organization to have a part in the alumni gift of \$146,000 to the University at Greensboro, set as the chosen financial goal for the year. The beginning date for the local campaign will be announced shortly.

There are 179 alumni of UNC-G living in Cleveland County, most of whom attended the institution during the years it was known as the Woman's College of UNC or North Carolina College for Women.

Similar county and community organizations involving 50 groups will make personal visitations during the fall to invite alumni participation in the annual gift to the University.

Last year in a similar campaign \$131,500 was contributed. The annual giving program has been in operation for six years, with increases each successive year.

Funds raised during the campaign are allocated by the Alumni Annual Giving Council for vital campus programs not provided for by state appropriations. These include 28 alumni scholarships worth \$750 each annually and renewable by the holders on satisfactory academic progress. Other projects include an Alumni Distinguished Professorship, two

PROPER BEDDING AIDS HEALTH

Chicago, Ill. (WMNS) — What's the most important household article you own? More than 98 per cent of physicians asked that question responded with the same answer: The correct bed.

Here are some tips from the American Medical Association on what your bed should do for you: A comfortable mattress and spring will help you relax easily and fall asleep. After sleep comes, the right bedding will help you change your position during the night. This may happen as often as 45 times a night, and it is nature's way of giving all your muscles a chance to relax. If you "fight your mattress" it's not right for you.

Support is as important as comfort. Too soft a mattress gives improper support. This may lead to low back pain and muscle fatigue. One too hard may not conform to your body's contours, may cause strains and "hollows" in the small of the back.

The proper mattress should have surface softness to provide gentle grading, help relax muscles, and relieve tensions. Soft but firm, these are the keys. Any sagging and it's time for a mattress change.

UNPLANNED PREGNANCIES HIT AS 'SOCIAL CANCER'

London, Eng. (WMNS) — "The unplanned pregnancy is a social cancer that erodes the integrity of our family structure." This is what Dr. Norman F. Morris, a professor of obstetrics and gynecology, told a meeting of the Royal Society of Health.

He noted that only 25 to 35 per cent of all pregnancies were planned. In 1966 some 38,500 brides under 20 were pregnant before marriage — or one in three. That same year there were 67,000 illegitimate births in England and Wales.

Dr. Morris estimated that 100,000 illegal abortions are performed annually in his country.

Another physician urged that all medical students receive basic instruction and information on family planning so that they would be equipped to help their patients in this vital area of their lives.

INFANTS' CRIES SIGNAL DISTRESS

New York (WMNS) — As every experienced mother knows, a baby's cries will differ according to his needs. One kind of howl means "I'm starving to death," another "I'm sopping wet, come change me."

Doctors, too, are clued into a newborn's health by his cry. "The character of the cry is of great diagnostic importance," Dr. James M. Toomey, of the University of Rochester School of Medicine, told physicians attending a recent medical meeting here.

Stridor, a harsh whistly sound resulting from partial obstruction of the air passages, may indicate a decrease in the opening of the larynx. Or it may accompany other airway narrowing.

A deep barking sound may indicate problems with the trachea, while a muffled cry may indicate obstruction elsewhere. A weak or absent cry, wheezing, a loud stuttering cry — all these are an infant's way of calling for help, the physician observed. And physicians are alert — as mothers are — to the nuances of crying.
