WASHINGTON REPORT

by Congressman James T. Broyhill THE SEPTEMBER SESSION

The Congress is straggling back to Washington to take care of the loose ends of legislation left dangling a month ago when the political spotlight turned on the selection of presidential candidates at Miami Beach and Chicago. Now that this mission has been accomplished and the nation is digesting what it saw and heard at the conventions, attention now returns to the nation's capital. Even in Washington's political climate, the atmosphere is charged with the mounting fury of the Presidential campaign.

It would have been possible to wind up the essential work of the Congress and adjourn before August 1 if a concentrated effort had been made. As it stands now, though, things will rock along for a few more weeks. Predictions from the leadership express "the feeling and the hope" that Congress can close shop about October 1. There are some big "ifs" however, and there is a basis for the comments in the corridor that December 1 may be a more realistic date.

Virtually all of the "must" bills involve appropriations legislation to operate various Federal activities for the fiscal year. All but three of these money bills have been acted upon by the House. Two of the remaining bills have been fully considered by the House Appropriations Committee and are ready to be brought to the floor for debate. However, both have been delayed because the House and Senate are in disagreement about the terms of authorization bills that must precede the actual money legislation.

The blockbuster defense appropriations bill recommends a cut of about \$5 billion from the President's request for an appropriation of \$77 billion for defense spending this year. The plan is not intended to cut funds or impair operations in the Vietnam War. Rather, the cuts are more in the nature of delays in defense spending. Even so, the continuing arguments between the House and Senate about such matters as intercontinental ballistic missile defense system will have to be resolved before the Department of Defense money bill can be brought out for a debate.

Also ready to go, but held up by a procedural snag, is the much anticipated money bill for the foreign aid program. A \$1 billion cut in this program is expected to be recommended as the bill comes out of the Appropriations Committee. Considering the present contentious mood of the House, further paring of foreign aid funds is a distinct possibility. The big imponderable in the Congress is the angry debate about the recommendation by President Johnson naming Justice Abe Fortas as Chief Justice of the United States Supreme Court. How long this debate continues will be

the principal factor in determining when Congress adjourns. Since only the Senate confirms White House appointments, House members will be spectators in one of the more unusual debates in recent years. From all reports, the forces opposing the Fortas nomination in the Senate are gathering strength and it seems now that a long discussion is assured.

In our system of government, there is little or no opportunity for a formal debate on the Supreme Court. The Fortas nomination has provided that opportunity for consideration of the political and philosophical currents which a significant group of the American people want explored. We are assured that the debate will occur in the Senate unless the President withdraws the nomination. This could well mean that the Congress will drag on its work for weeks or months.

Although the situation is a very fluid one, the House Rules Committee apparently intends to stick to its decision not to consider any new legislation. If this decision stands, virtually no new proposals can flow out of the legislative committees, thus closing down the House. This signals the wind-up of a Congress that has been unusually torn by dissension over the direction the country ought to go — an argument we saw in Chicago and one which will now be carried to the people for their decision in November.

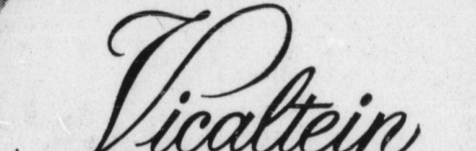
