## Strokes Are Major Problems

CHAPEL HILL — Strokes are one of our major health problems. They effect hundreds of thousands of people every year. North Carolina has one of the highest stroke-to-population ratios of any state in our country.

Since 1950 the stroke death rate has been declining and great advances have been made in treatment and rehabilitation. With modern care many patients are being restored to a useful life.

What is a stroke? A stroke occurs when the blood supply to a part of the brain is reduced or cut off and, as a result, the nerve cells in that part of the brain cannot function either.

The result of a stroke may be, for example, weakness or paralysis of one side of the body, inability to walk, loss of memory, or difficulty in speaking. These effects may be slight or very severe. They may be temporary or permanent. Strokes occur when the blood supply to the brain is curtailed for some reason.

While strokes often occur without notice, sometimes there are signs on impending danger. Regular medical check-ups are the best protection against stroke and they should begin long before a person has reached middle age. Individuals who detect signs of numbness or weakness in a hand or leg and the temporary slurring of speech should see their physician immediately. While these physical phenomena are not necessary indications of a stroke, medical evaluation is important in determining whether these and other symptoms are related to stroke or some other disease.

This is the third in a series on house plants.

There are many types of containers that may be used for growing house plants—clay, plastic and metal. Perhaps the clay containers are best because they are porous and permit some air exchange which supplies oxygen for the roots. Due to the porous nature of the clay, more frequent watering is necessary as compared with either plastic or metal pots.

Regardless of the type container used, it is essential that bottom drainage be provided. This can be done by placing a piece of broken clay pot over the drainage hole and a thin layer of coarse gravel over the entire bottom area. I would not recommend the use of any type container that does not have an opening for bottom drainage.

There is no set schedule that can be recommended for watering plants. The amount and frequency of watering will depend upon size and kind of plant, type of container used, and stage of growth.

When watering, soak the soil well and then let the soil become dry-to-touch before watering again. As a general rule, most soils will become lighter in color as they dry but a soil high in organic matter may be deceptive in this respect. Never let your plants

wilt for lack of water.

Various types of self-watering devices may be used—wicks in the bottom of a pot, etc. If you have used self-watering devices successfully, I would not suggest that you change. However, I expect, that, for most people surface watering is the better plan. When watering such plants as African violets, cyclamen and gloxinia avoid getting water in the crowns of the plant as it may cause rotting.

The temperature of the water is important. Water used should be at room temperature and preferably, applied in the morning. If you want to catch and store rainwater for your plants this may be done. However, we have no evidence that chlorine and fluorine treated water is injurious to plants.

Humidity in the home is always a problem and is difficult to control. Any means used to control humidity will be helpful. One means of compensating for low humidity would be to spray the foliage of your plants, once or twice a week, with soft tepid water. For this, rainwater would be fine.

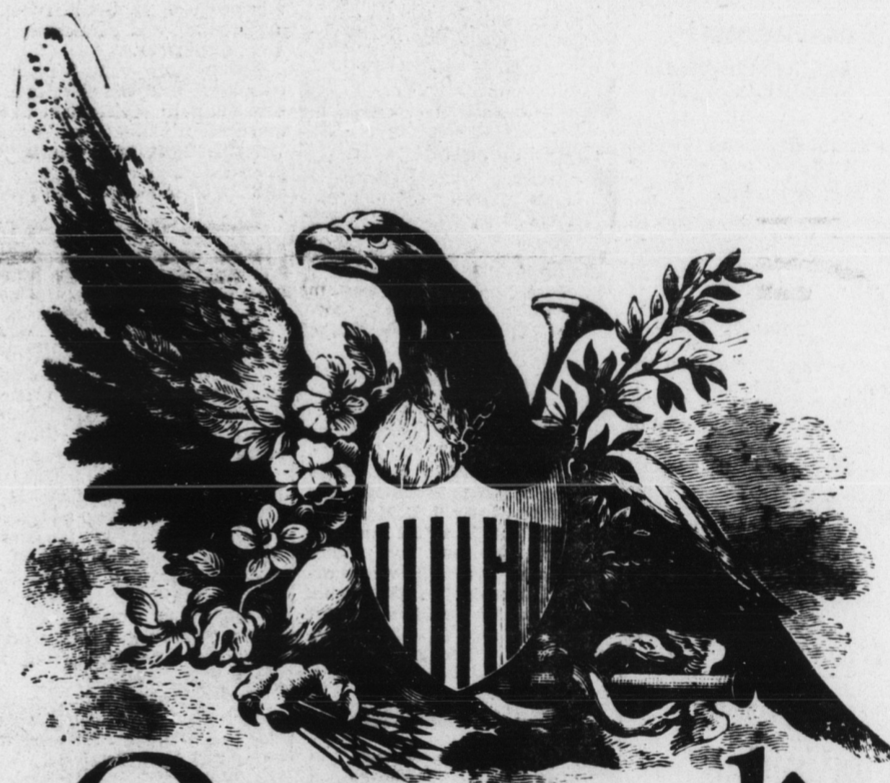
