TAX LISTING

Thursday, Jan. 2 Through Monday, Feb. 3, 1969 Inclusive LIST IN YOUR TOWNSHIP

All persons are notified that we will be at the following places on the dates given for the purpose of listing taxes. All taxpayers are warned that a penalty will be added if they fail to list taxes during the month of January.

In addition to all other penalties prescribed by law, any person, firm or corporation whose duty it shall be to list any poll or property, real or personal, who willfully fails or refuses to list the same within the time allowed by or who removes or conceals property for the purpose of evading taxation, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00) or imprisonment not to exceed thirty days; and any person, firm or corporation aiding or abetting the removal or concealment of property for the purpose of evading taxation shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00) or imprisonment not to exceed thirty days. The failure to list shall be prima facie evidence that such failure was willful.

FARM CENSUS NOTE

FARM CENSUS: Each farm owner shall prepare a list of the average of each crop grown, including tenths of acres of truck. The list should show the total acres cultivated by the owner, also the acres cultivated by all tenants on each separately recognized farm, the acres in improved pasture, woodland, idle and other lands. He shall be prepared to report the number of bearing fruit trees, the numbers of livestock of breeding age, number of hogs sold or slaughtered during the pass 12 months and tons of fertilizers to be used during this crop year. This information is kept confidential and has no relation to taxes. Its purpose is for agricultural, educational, economic analysis and safer guidance of county agents and farmers gen-
