Further information on veterans benefits may be obtained at any VA office. Q-I was wounded in Vietnam and evacuated to a military hospital in the United States. I will be separated from service at

this hospital. Will I receive any counseling or information about veteran benefits before separation?

A-Yes. A Veterans Adminis tration representative will visit you at the hospital to advise you of your veteran benefits. Further he will help you file for these benefits. After separation, your records will be forwarded to the VA regional office having controj over your records. That of-fice will follow up to insure any applications you filed at the military hospital are processed in a timely manner.
