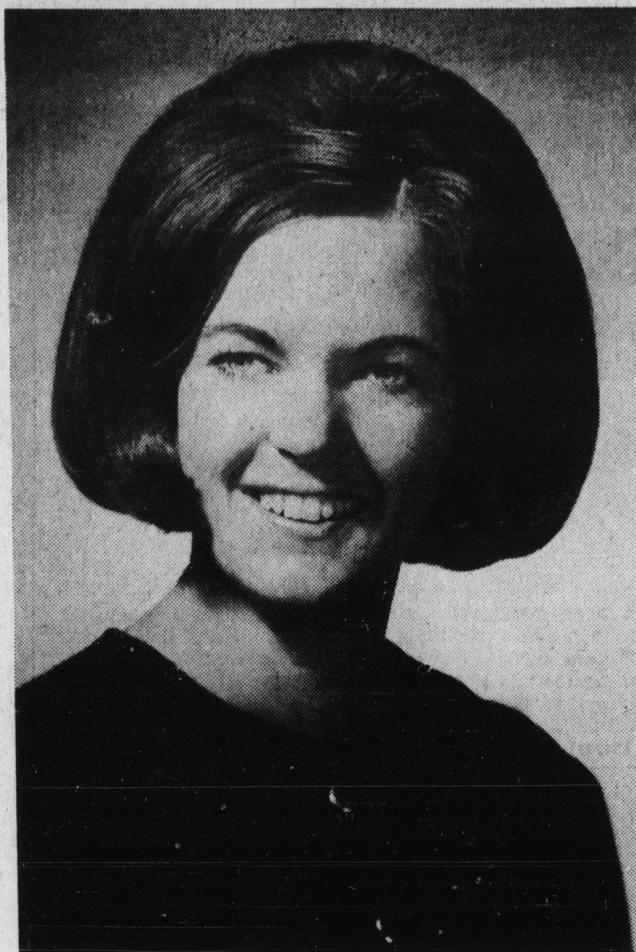

Foundation Grant Of \$88,000 Awarded Girl Scouts Of Pioneer Scout Council

Thomas O. Moore, Jr., chairman of the Consulting Commission for the Pioneer Girl Scout Area Council, announced today that the Council has received an \$88,000 grant from the Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation with which to begin construction at the new camp site facility located in Golden Valley Township, Rutherford County, N. C.

The Council Board of Directors and the Consulting Commission of the Council feel particularly gratified that this first generous memorial gift will bring to reality the long expressed desire of the Girl Scouts in the Council for a body of water adequate in size for a real waterfront program.

The Girl Scout Consulting Commission and Advisory Group, composed of over 350 interested prominent citizens in the four county area, will conduct a capital fund campaign early in 1970 for the balance of the funds.

The beginning construction will be a large dam which will produce a 15-acre lake with boat dock and swimming piers. This lake will be dedicated to the memory of the late Mrs. James H. Hilton. Mrs. Hilton was the former Lois Baker of Story County, Iowa. She was active in Girl Scouting most of her life, having joined her first troop in 1913. She served as a counselor at Camp Ledges on the Iowa River in Boone, Iowa. As an adult she continued her leadership role in Scouting.

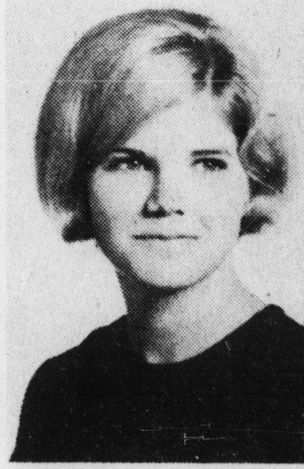
