Park Target For Vandals

Kings Mountain National Military Park is increasingly becoming the target for vandals.

In recent months there have been instances where expensive signs have been removed from the front of the Visitor Center, traffic signs removed from the road, names and initials have been scratched into markers and monuments, paint has been used to mark on monuments, letters have been chipped and broken from monuments, and valuable artifacts have been stolen from the park.

The most recent act resulted in the removal of the unusual old mile stone marker from the old Yorkville-Shelbyville Stage Coach road which runs through the park, and used to be the main road connecting Shelby, N. C., and York, S. C.

This famous old marker was approximately the half way point between the two towns—indicating the distance on one side as "S.V. 17" (Shelbyville 17 miles) and "Y. V. 19" (Yorkville 19

miles). It is believed that these stones were originally placed at one mile intervals all along the road. This old stone is the last one known to exist.

It is hoped that the stone may be recovered, and that other stones may possibly be recovered when people learn what they are. The stones are from three to four feet high. They are approximately six inches thick and twelve inches wide.

All signs, markers, monuments, and artifacts have been provided in the park to aid the approximately 350,000 visitors who come to the park each year in understanding the significance of this important battle of the American Revolution.

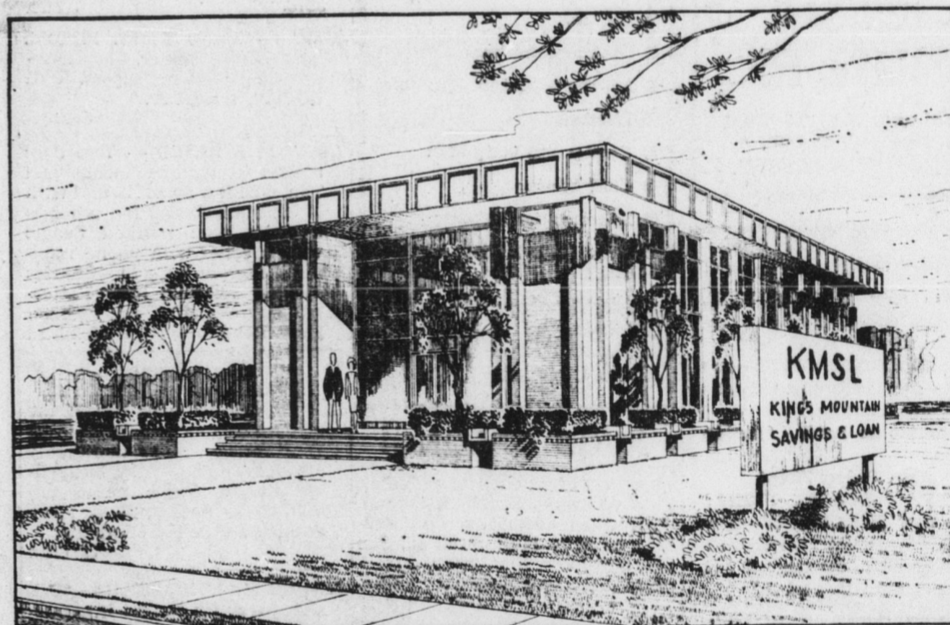
