### Local Alumni Reach Top Goal In Fund Drive

DUE WEST, S. C.—Kings Mountain, N. C. was among the 102 towns and communities that showed 95 per cent or better participation in the 1969-70 Erskine College Living Endowment Campaign.

Mrs. John Cheshire served as Bessemer, Ala., Commander Carrier Division Three.

Each town reaching the 95 per cent goal claimed a \$25 challenge gift for the campaign. Altogether, the campaign has already claimed the entire \$10,000 challenge made by 25 alumni and friends of the college.

Living Endowment pledges as of Homecoming, December 13, totaled \$161,418, approximately \$15,000 ahead of the 1968-69 campaign at the same time. The Living Endowment, which helps provide current operating income for the college, has received six national awards from the American Alumni Council for alumni participation.
