Building Design Is Announced

Congressman James T. Broyhill was notified today that General Services Administration has announced the design for the new Gastonia Social Security District office on West Third Avenue. The 8,400 gross square foot building, estimated to cost \$158,800.00, was designed by Charlie Morrison Grier and Associates, Inc. of Charlotte. The exterior walls are to be brick with a precast cover base. At the front elevation, a wide projecting cornice of the same material is built to shield the upper part of the windows and the recessed entrance. "The one story structure," Robert Kunsz, Administrator of GSA said, "is characterized by simplicity of design expressive of the office type function to be carried on within." Surface parking for 42 vehicles will also be provided.

General Wolfe C. O. In Alaska

Brig. Gen. William R. Wolfe Jr., United States Army, son of Col. (US Army, Retired) and Mrs. William R. Wolfe of Dallas Rt. 1, has recently assumed his new duties as Deputy Commanding General of the United States Army, Alaska. General Wolfe, his wife Sarah, and two of their four children are at home at Fort Wainwright, near Fairbanks, Alaska, where General Wolfe represents the Commanding General, United States Army Alaska, north of the Alaska Range. Prior to his promotion and his current assignment, General Wolfe served in the Organization of the Joint Chiefs of Staff in Washington, D. C. Appointed to the United States Military Academy at West Point by the late Senator Reynolds, General Wolfe graduated in 1945 and was commissioned in the Field Artillery. Following service in the Philippine Islands and Japan, he attended Vanderbilt University, receiving the Master of Arts degree in 1950. After service in Korea, General Wolfe graduated from the Command and General Staff College, the Armed Forces Staff College, and the Army War College. In 1968-69 he commanded the Division Artillery, 1st Cavalry Division (Airmobile) in Vietnam, taking part in the operations to relieve the Khe Sanh Combat Base and the assault into the A Shau Valley.

SHC To Hold Public Hearing

RALEIGH — The North Carolina State Highway Commission will hold a public hearing on February 17 on a proposed expansion of a rest area and the construction of a Welcome Center on I-85, five miles northeast of the South Carolina border. The hearing will be held in the Grover Rescue Building in Grover at 2 p.m. and will be conducted by R. W. McGowan, chief engineer for reconstruction with the commission. Plans call for the expansion of the rest area on the southbound lane and the construction of a new Welcome Center on the northbound lane, to serve travelers entering the state from South Carolina. McGowan said a map showing the proposed locations is posted in the Cleveland County Courthouse.
