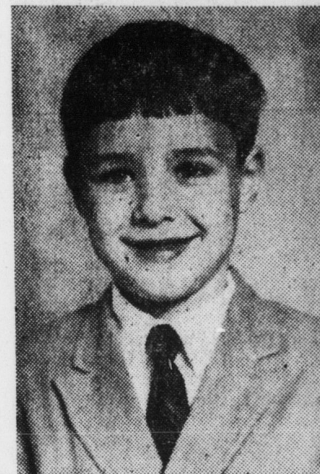
Barefoot In Park Try-Outs Continue

Groomsmen, all brothers of

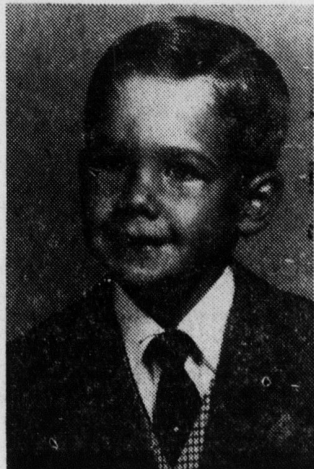
